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



Through the Eyes of a Crone: Beltane - For Mature Readers Only

This morning, as I was starting to do some "inside chores" (aka cleaning up incense dust and tackling the Pile of Laundry™), my spouse stopped me at the top of the stairs with one of "those" kisses. You know – those kisses that take your breath away, make you forget what you're doing, and bring a flush to your ears. At least, that's what usually happens.

I should stop here and give a warning: This is not the issue you want to leave lying around for your underage household members to find! We're going to get down and dirty in this article. We're going to explore some really adult themes, and your kiddos don't need to know about them. M'kay? 18+ only, thanks!

So why do we have a disclaimer? Why, it's Beltane, of course! The Mother of All Fertility Festivals! We do it all for the nookie! That is, um, I mean... We do it all to honor the Great Marriage/Rite and the intertwining of Goddess and God while they bless the land and ensure continued prosperity, crops, and children..... Ah, but the nookie!

We know the history and meaning behind Beltane. Like Imbolc, it's got a strong emphasis on fertility. Beltane takes it further in that it is the stirrings of that fertility that were promised months ago. We are outside, baby! We dance, prep plants for transplants, tend to gardens and parties, and get really active outside. All of these "raise the blood," and, understandably, we all want to have "those" moments along with the rest of the species on this earth.

But we're crones. Or older men. And we're tired, and our bones hurt, and things just don't work the way they did. So what can we do about it? Is there a place for a crone in this frenzy of, well, nookie???

(Okay, seriously, take this issue out of your kids' hands now.)

The first step in having an enjoyable Beltane is to know thyself. Do you have a floor-length mirror? If not, get one. They're cheap at a dollar store and can be hung on the back of the door. Get naked and LOOK at your-self. Gods above and below, you are GORGEOUS. Each curve, hollow, stretch mark, bump, and wrinkle tells the tale of your life, and it's the most interesting story you have. Like you stripped off your clothing, strip off the expectations of modern media and society and the "commercialization of youth." You are breathtaking. Literally. You take a breath, and you do so much with it – you speak, you sing, you move, you create, and you rest. All of those things are accomplished by that body there before you in the mirror. Close your eyes, touch your skin. That skin that has protected you and expanded and contracted through all of the seasons of your existence. Touch it and be touched by it, and marvel at this largest organ of your body. This is what has held you together for decades. This is what has taken the bruises of life and the cuts of circumstance, healed itself, and made scar tissue that is even stronger and allows you to move about this earth. THIS skin is YOUR skin – no one else's, and isn't it lovely? How dull it would be if it was plain. Look now at your freckles, your stretch marks (or honor stripes), your little extra skin bits, and the places where hair grows and where it doesn't.

Be your own lover at this moment. Would you shy away from the marks and signs of a life well lived in the one beside you in bed? Absolutely not. So why do you shy away from them now? They are YOURS, and those unique characteristics love you. Love them back. You're so amazing, and your absolute beauty reflects back at you. Along with this odd mix of repression and progression, no one talked to us about what age does to our sex lives or what to do about it. After all, grandparents didn't get laid! What a disgusting thought!

But – here we are, grandparents (or old enough to be), and gosh darn it, I still wanna do it all for the nookie! My brain, my heart, and my soul still sing for intimacy and pleasure, even if my body disagrees. So what to do?

Have an open, honest conversation with your medical provider before exploring methods to "bring back the spark." Some of these advertised "cures" are worse than the disease, especially if you have underlying medical conditions. (Second disclaimer – I am certainly not a medical professional, so please do not say, "The Crone Told Me To Take This Crazy Herbal Concoction" because I absolutely did not.)

This is not the end of your worth, your romantic value, or your relationships. We don't cut milk with a cheese knife. We don't make jelly from wine.

The only constant in our existence is change, and the Wheel turns whether we will it to or not. Ride with it and embrace each other tightly. As we journey along this life path, new things take the place of the old, and that's the way it should be. No one should ever be shamed or forced into actions they no longer wish to take. That includes sexual activities.

A Dictionary of Angels

ANERETON—ARAFIEL

ANERETON אנרטון (Anaireton) "a high holy angel of God" invoked in Solomonic rites.

ANFIEL אבפיאל (Anafiel, "branch of God") a guard of the 4th Heaven. Anfiel's crown "branches out to cover Heaven with the divine majesty." He is head and chief of the porters and seal-bearers of the 7 Heavens.

ANGERECTON אנגירקטון (Angrecton) a great angel, invoked in magical rites, specifically in the invocation at fumigation.

ANGROMAINYUS אנגרומייניס In early form of Ahriman, the Zoroastrian equivalent of the Judaeo-Christian Satan, although he is not a fallen angel and is not subject to the overlordship of God. Angromainyus was God's opposite and opponent from the beginning (in Persian lore). In the Zendavesta, Angromainyus, pregnant with death, leaps from Heaven in the form of a serpent -a form in which he is not infrequently represented. He tries to deceive Zoroaster (Zarathustra) and to cause the latter to rebel against Ahura Mazda (the Persian equivalent of the sovereign power), but fails.

ANIEL (Haniel) אניאל one of the numerous angelic guards of the gates of the West Wind.

ANIHI'EL אניחיאל one of the angel princes whom God appointed to the sword.

ANIQUEL אניקל one of the 7 great princes of the spirits, represented in the form of a serpent of paradise. One of the seven grand dukes of the infernal regions.

ANITOR אניטור high holy angel of god, invoked in magical rites after proper investiture by the invocant.

ANIXIEL אניקסיאל one of the 28 angels governing the 20 mansions of the moon.

ANMAEL (Chnum) אומאל one of the leaders of the fallen angels, sometimes identified with Semyaza for Anmael, like Semyaza, makes a bargain with a mortal woman (Istahar) in connection with the revelation of the Explicit Name (of God).

ANNAUEL אנאואל one of the 72 angels bearing the name of God Shemhamphorae.

ANPIEL אנפיל in rabbinic lore, an angel in charge of the protection of birds. He resides in the 6th Heaven, where he is a supervising chief of 70 gates. With 70 crowns he crowns all prayers that ascend to Heaven from the earth and transmits the prayers tothe 7th Heaven for additional sanctification. Anpiel conveyed Enoch to Heaven.

ANSIEL אנסיאל an angel invoked in magical rites.

ANTIEL אנטיאל an angel's name found inscribed on an oriental Hebrew charm to ward off evil.

ANUSH בוש Anush one of 3 administering angels (the other 2 being Aebel and Shetel) whom God appointed to serve Adam. The celestial trio "roasted meat" for our first parent and even "cooled his wine".

APAR or APARSIEL אפר angel in service to Sadqiel, ruler of the 5th day.

APHAROPH (Apholph, Afarof) אפארוף an angel equated with Raphael and believed to be "the only true name of God."

APHREDON אפרדון in gnosticism, a great celestial entity dwelling in the Pleroma with his 12 Just Ones. He is a ruler of the Indivisible.

APRAGSIN אפרגסין (Apragsih) a divine messenger appointed by God to the sword also known as Assi Asihih.

APSU IDDRin Babylonian mythology, Apsu is a female (?) angel of the abyss; "father" of the Babylonian gods as well as "wife" of Tamat. Apsu is finally slain by his (her) son Ea.

APUDIEL אפודיאל One of the 7 underworld planetary rulers, called Electors. The demon Ganael serves uder the joint overlordship of Apudiel and Camael.

APUTEL **DIDN** invocation angel mentioned in Mathers, The Greater Key of Solomon; also the name that a priest bore on his breast when entering the holy of holies. The name was reputed to have had the virtue, when pronounced, of reviving the dead; when engraved on vessels of gold or brass, it loosened every form of evil.

AQRAB אקרב in Arabic mythology, an angel used for conjuring.

AQUACHAI אקווה־ג'אי (or Aqua) a holy name one of the nomina barbara used in Solomonic conjurations to command demons.

ARABONAS אראבונאס spirit invoked in prayer by the Master of the Art, in Solomonic rites.

ARAD שרד an Indo-Persian angel who protects religion and science.

ARAEBEL ארבל an angel of the 6th hour, serving under Samil.

ARAEL אראל (Ariel) "one of the spirits which the rabbis of Talmud made price over the people of the birds."

ARAFIEL ערפיאל one of the great angelic princes representing "the divine strength, majesty, and power."

Dictionary of Angels

ARAKIEL—ARHUM HII

ARAKIEL ערקיאל (Greek: `Αραθακ Κιμβρα), also spelled Arâkîba, Araqiel, Araqael, Araciel, Arqael, Sarquael, Arkiel or Arkas, is a fallen angel, the second mentioned of the 20 Watcher leaders of the 200 fallen angels in the Book of Enoch, who taught the "signs of the earth" (which suggests geomancy) to humans during the days of Jared. Arakiel is also called Aretstikapha (meaning "world of distortion" [the combination of arets + kaphah]) in Chapter 69. His name is generally translated as "earth of God"; the combination of araq-earth (Babylonian in origin) and El-God. Michael Knibb lists him as a combination of two names "the land of the mighty one" or "the land is mighty".

ARAMAITI אראמיתי one of the 6 amesha spentas, representing holy harmony.

ARARIEL אריאל (also called Azariel) is an angel who, according to the rabbis of the Talmud, takes charge of the waters of the earth. Fishermen invoke him so that they may take large fish.

Arariel has also traditionally been invoked as a cure for stupidity.

ARARITA ארריטה (Araritha) a name inscribed on a cabalistic sigil in connection with Solomonic conjurations and employed to command demons; if the name is inscribed on a gold plate, the invocant is assured he will not die a sudden death. Ararita is considered to be the "verbum inenerrabile" (the ineffable word or name) of God.

ARASBARASBIEL ארסבראסביאל an angelic guard of the 6th Heaven.

ARASEK ארסק form of Nisroc mentioned by Josephus.

ARATHIEL ארתיאל chief angel of the 1st hour of the night, serving under Gamiel.

ARATHRON ארתרון (Aratron) 1st of the Olympian spirits governing the planet Saturn; he rules 49 of the 196 Olympic Provinces. Arathron teaches alchemy, magic, and medicine, and is able to make a person invisible. He can also cause barren women to become fertile.

ARAUCHIA אראוכיה angel's name found inscribed in Hebrew characters on the 3rd pentacle of the planet Saturn.

ARAXIEL ארקסיאל
Araxiel is mentioned as one of the fallen angels.

ARAYEKAEL אראייקאל one of the many angel princes appointed by God to the sword.

ARAZIEL ארזיאל (Arazjal, Arazyal, ATriel, Esdreel, Sahariel, Seriel, Saniel, etc., "My moon is God") an angel who sinned when

he descended to earth to unite with mortal women. Araziel governed with Bagdal, the sign of the Bull (Taurus).

ARBATEL ארבאטל "revealing" angel.

ARBGDOR ארבגדור an angel governing one of the months.

ARBIEL ארביל an angel serving Anael, ruler of the 6th day.

ARCAN ארקן king of the angels of the air, ruler of Monday. Arcan's ministers are Bilet, Missabut, Abuhazah.

ARCHAN ארכן angel who exercised dominion over the lower rays of the moon. May be the same as Arcan.

ARCHANA ארקנה angel's name found inscribed in Hebrew characters ont he 5th pentacle of the planet Saturn.

ARCHARZEL ארכרזל an angel invoked in ritual magica by the Master of the Arts.

ARCHER קשת governing spirit of Aquarius. Archer shares this post with Ssakmakiel.

ARCICIAH ארצ'יה an angel of earth.

ARDAREL ארדראל in occult lore the angel of fire.

ARDEFIEL or ARDESIEL ארדפיאל one of the 28 angels ruling the 28 mansions of the moon.

ARDIBEHIST ארדיבהיסט in ancient Persian religion, the angel of April and one of the Amesha spentas. Ardibehist governed the 3rd day of the month.

ARDOUISUR ארדואיסור (Arduisher) in Zoroastrianism, Ardouisur is a female ized (i.e., cherub). Among the attributes of this cherub is making females prolific and giving them easy child-birth and even supplying them with breastmilk. Her title is "giver of living water."

an angel ruling the month of Tammuz (June-July).

AREHANAH ארחנה name of an angel inscribed on the 3rd pentacle of the planet Saturn.

AREL אראל an angel of fire. The name Arel is found inscribed on the 7th pentacle of the sun. Arel is an angel invoked in ritual magic.

ARFIEL ארפיאל another name for the angel Raphael. Arfiel is an angelic guard stationed in the 2nd Heaven.

ARGHIEL ארגיאל an angel invoked in magical rites.

ARHUM HII ארהום היי (Rhum) in Mandean lore, one of the malki (uthri angels) of the North Star.

ARIAS—ARTIYAH' IL

ARIAS אריות angel who rules over sweet-smelling herbs. In occultism, Arias is regarded as a demon and is one of the 12 marguises of the infernal empire.

ARIEL (Hebrew: אראל, 'romanized: Ari'el, Arael or Ariael) is an angel found primarily in Jewish and Christian mysticism and Apocrypha. The literal meaning is "lion of God." The word Ariel occurs in the Hebrew Bible at Isaiah 29:1, 29:2, and 29:7, where it refers to Jerusalem. The word appears at II Samuel 23:20 and I Chronicle 11:22 as referring to "men of valor" of Moab. It appears at Ezekiel 43:16 as referring to an "altar hearth," and it appears at Ezra 8:16 as the name of a Jewish man. It's also said that Ariel is not a rebel Angel.

In Thomas Heywood "Hierarchy of the Blessed Angels (1635) Ariel is called both a prince who rules the waters and "Earth's great Lord." In several occult writings, Ariel is mentioned with other elemental titles such as the "3rd archon of the winds," "spirit of air," "angel of the waters of the Earth" and "wielder of fire." In mysticism, especially modern, Ariel is usually depicted as a governing angel with dominion over the Earth, creative forces, the North, elemental spirits, and beasts. Other entries in angelologies to Ariel are found in Jacques Collin de Plancy Dictionnaire Infernal (1863) and Moïse Schwab Vocabulaire de l'Angélologie (1897).

ARIOC אריוק (Ariukh, Oriockh) in Jewish legend, a guardian angel of the ancestors or offspring of Enoch, appointed by God to preserve the Enoch writings. In Genesis, Arioc is the name of an executioner.

ARIOCH(אריוך) a demon of vengeance, a follower of Satan, a fallen angel.

ARMAITA ארמאיטה (Aramaiti, Armaiti) in Persian mythology, one of the 6 or 7 amesha spentas or archangels. She is the spirit of truth, wisdom, and goodness who became incarnate and visited the earth "to help the good".

ARMÂRÔS (Aramaic: Αρεαως) was the eleventh on a list of 20 leaders of a group of 200 fallen angels called Grigori or "Watchers" in the Book of Enoch. The name means "cursed one" or "accursed one". The name 'Armaros' is likely a Greek corruption of what may be an Aramaic name; Armoni is possibly the original (according to this, he may be identified as Armoniel, also mentioned in chapter 7 in the Book of Enoch). Michael Knibb, Professor of Old Testament Studies at King's College London, lists the meaning of his name as being "the one from Hermon".

"Then sware they all together and bound themselves by mutual

imprecations upon it. And they were in all two hundred; who descended in the days of Jared on the summit of Mount Hermon, and they called it Mount Hermon, because they had sworn and bound themselves by mutual imprecations upon it." - Book of Enoch

ARMAS ארמאס angel invoked in magical rites at the close of the Sabbath.

ARMASA "(ארמסה the great lord") an angel in Aramaic incantations.

ARMAZIEL ארמזיאל (Armisael?) a gnostic entity.

ARMEN ארמן (Ramiel? Arakiel? Baraqel?) one of the fallen angels listed in Enoch I, 69.

ARMESI ארמסי angel of the 10th hour of the day, serving under the suzerainty of the angel Oriel.

ARMESIEL ארמסיל an angel of the 4th hour of the night, serving under Jefischa.

ARMIEL ארמיל an angel officer of the 11th hour of the night, serving under Dardariel

ARMIMAS ארמימס (Armimimas) an angel invoked in magical rites at the close of the Sabbath. Hermes or Ormuzd.

ARMISAEL ארמיסאל angel of the womb. In Talmud it is recommended that, to ease a confinement, one should recite Psalm 20 nine times, but if this doesn not prove efficacious, then one should try the following invocation; "I conjure you, Armisael, angel who governs the womb, that you help this woman and the child in her body."

ARMON ארמון one of the angels of the 2nd chora or altitude invokend in magic prayer.

ARPHUGITONOS רפוגיטונוס one of the 9 angels who will rule "at the end of the world".

ARSYALALYUR ארסיאליור an angel sent to Enoch with a special message from God; also to Lamech's son Noah to warn him of the impending flood. The name is a corruption or amagamation of Israel and Uriel.

ARTAKIFA ארטקיפה archangel mentioned in Enoch lore.

ARTIYA'IL ארטיעאיל: an angel in IUslamic lore, believed to remove the grief of humans. He is mentioned in the hadith collection of Jalal Al-Din Al-Suyuti: when Abu Muslim al-Khawlani was awaiting news from Byzantium, the angel came down in the shape of a bird and introduced himself as the angel Artiya'il, the angel who removes the memories of anxiety.

I can tend my garden and remove all old and blighted ideas that my stifle my path, I can bring my dreams into fruition.


I can realize my dreams and see them now springing forth into life, they are showing me their beauty and I know they soon will bear fruit.


Next you will then use the modifiers to determine how the house is affected by the other cards in the deck.

Adamite

Adamite, or hydrous zinc arsenate, was named for French mineralogist Gilbert-Joseph Adam (1795-1881). The crystals may be found in many colors, but commonly range from yellow to green. It is a fairly rare mineral and not of gem quality.

Adamite is classified as a member of the phosphate class, and is included **Chakras:** in the arsenate subclass. It has no commercial value as an ore, but is extracted in many places for sale to collectors as specimen pieces. The botryoidal crystals fluoresce strongly under ultra-violet light, showing a bright Keywords: green color, and even in daylight theya re an attractive pale green and display a high adamantine luster. It is usually found on limonite, but is also associated with aragonite, calcite, mimetite, smithsonite, and many others. Adamite has similar crystal structures to olivenite and libethenite.

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The Star and the Fool By Emily Thornton



At this time, the Fool has been broken down and made it through the Tower. If one has ever been depressed with no vision of what is to come, this is a good example of what the Fool is feeling after his time with the Tower. It is now time to rest and recuperate. His recuperation takes the form of the Star.

The Star is number 17 in the major arcana. This card is hauntingly beautiful with a great message for anyone who has been through the Tower. This card promises new opportunities, healing and hap-

piness. There is a real sense of relief when this card is pulled in a reading. Spirit is telling them, it is time to rest and recuperate. It is recognizing that one has worked so hard and their journey has been rough, it is ok to rest.

Looking at the card itself, one can immediately see, there is no path or road. If one looks at the other Major Arcana cards, one can see there is some sort of path or focus that is shown. The card really says, do not focus on moving ahead right now, now is the time to sleep and recuperate.

There are a lot of symbols in this card that accentuate its beauty. There is a lot of blue in this card. Blue skies, blue water, blue tinged skin (in some cards) which signify the attitudes of the subconscious mind. It is usually associated with the element of water and has a calm, spiritual, introspection to it. It also tells the querent to be open to freedom, imagination, expansion and inspiration. It is ok to be sensitive here. The blue wants the Fool to take stock in everything.

There is one large star in the center and numerous little stars surrounding it. The large star is our guide that leads us forward. The little stars are our energy centers, like the chakras, and they signify how we are connected to the soul and our spiritual self.

The figure in the middle, pouring the water, is an example of the goddess or Egyptian goddess being vulnerable. We see she has one foot in the water and one on land. She is balanced and knows how to balance herself with the grounding of the earth and the spiritual aspect of the water.

The bird on the card is an Ibis. It reminds us to keep a higher perspective. We have the abilities to fish, collect our resources (goddess getting the water), and have the tools we need to help us get the energy needed.

The mountain signifies the goals that are still there and available to us. There is a real peace and calm here in the card. The action of pouring the water is a way we are sharing with the collective consciousness that is available in the spirit realm and Mother

Earth. The Goddess is pouring what she has learned into the collective unconscious so people can learn from what she has experienced. There is a real balance here between where we are on our journey and how we give back to the earth and the consciousness. We need that balance to finish our journey.

With the Star Card it is all about healing of the soul and connecting back into abundance and higher self. Connect with that intuition and recuperate from where you have been. When this card comes up, it is also considered a time of manifesting.

To connect with the Star card's energy, focus on self-care and inner reflection. Engage in activities that promote relaxation and spiritual connection, like meditation, spending time in nature, or creative pursuits. Pay attention to your intuition and dreams, as they may offer guidance. Embrace vulnerability and be open to receiving healing and inspiration. Consider journaling about your hopes and dreams, or creating a vision board to visualize future possibilities. The Star encourages trusting the process of healing and believing in a brighter future.





SMUDGING

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WHAT IS SMUDGING?

Smudging is the moving of smoke from various sacred herbs through a space, your personal energy field (or that of another being) or around objects such as crystals, stones or sacred tools. It comes to us from Native American traditions, but many peoples and many cultures have echoed the principle.

WHY SMUDGE?

Smudging clears negative energy and purifies the physical and finer environments. Everything and everyone has an energetic (auric) field around it/them. These fields can become contaminated with negative vibrations and thoughtforms. These negative energetics, if not removed, can cause disharmony, imbalance, depression and illness. Sometimes these negative energies are left in our environment from contact with others who are creating or harboring them. Sometimes they form tenacious connecting cords draining energy and vitality. Smudging can eliminate these imbalances and restore harmony.

WHAT YOU NEED TO SMUDGE

- 1. Sacred herbs chosen for their inherent qualities or vibrations see possible choices we have listed.
- **2.** Shell or receptacle you can use to burn the herbs. A shell is the Native American traditional choice. A fire resistant open dish-like container is necessary as it prevents stray smoldering embers from burning furniture, carpeting or clothing.
- 3. A feather is used to sweep the smoke generated by the smoldering herbs through the space needing cleansed.
- **4**. Matches or lighter to light the herbs. With a smudge stick or bundle, however, the easiest way is to light a candle and light the bundle from that steady flame.

HOW TO SMUDGE

Note: To avoid fire hazards, do not use smudge around flammable surfaces. Never leave burning smudge, candles or fire unattended.

- 1. Gather needed items.
- 2. Light smudge until the end glows red and then fan it to put out the flame. We are working with the smoke from the smoldering herbs; the flame needs to be extinguished. Do not blow out the flame, this puts your vital breath at cross-purposes with your intent.
- **3**. After lighting the smudge offer it to the four cardinal directions: East, South, West and North or hold it for a moment near your heart.
- 4. Hold the shell or bowl with the smoking smudge in one hand and fan it through space to be cleared.
- **5**. When finished give thanks.
- **6**. Tamp out any herbs still burning. For small embers use a spoon or stick to tamp it out if necessary.

SMUDGING A PERSON

Note: Because of the smoke emitted, avoid burning smudge in confined areas or around infants, anyone who is pregnant or suffering from asthma or respiratory conditions.

Begin by smudging the auric space – about 2 to 3 feet out from the body. Work from above the head to the feet. Move around the person in a clockwise manner. When you get to the feet, have the person lift up their feet, one at a time, as you sweep the smoke under each one. Go back above the head and go down the front, back and each side of the body, cleaning the energies that lie close to their form. Then hold the smudge in front of them so they can offer smoke to Father Sky, to Mother Earth and to take some to their heart. End by bowing to the other person as they return the bow to you.

SMUDGING A PLACE

Prepare the smudge for use as described above. In an enclosed space, open a door or window to provide a route for negative energies to leave as they move to get away from the smudge. Begin in the room that is the most distant from the open door or window. Start at the center of that room. Move through the room in ever widening clockwise circles. Fan the smoke from the smudge over, under and around objects. If any area feels "sticky" continue smudging until it feels clean to you. Use your finer intuitive senses as you work. Tell everything that you do not want in your space to "Leave now and go to the Light". Move to the next room and the next, repeating this procedure, moving any negativity ahead of you towards the opening. If you have left a door open for negativity to exit, smudge the doorway, step through and smudge the immediate area outside so "hitchhiking" lower thoughtforms don't ride back inside. Many people hang sweetgrass braids over doorways to allow only good energy to enter their space. Outdoors, begin smudging in the center of your sacred space. Move clockwise in ever increasing spirals until you reach the perimeter. Smudge each individual as described above as they enter the sacred space.

SMUDGING OBJECTS

Note: If setting your smudge shell or bowl down to clean objects be sure that it is on a stable fireproof surface.

For small items, such as tumbled stones or jewelry – put them in an open weave basket, sieve or strainer. Hold the container above the smudge and allow the smoke to rise and enter the container, bathing the small items in smoke.

For larger objects: Move around the object in a clockwise direction. Begin at the top and sweep smudge through the close energetic field and off towards the Earth.

Smudging clear quartz crystals: Remember that crystals store and amplify energy. Much like a computer they do not discriminate as to the type of energy put into them. When cleansing your space be sure to give them attention as well.

Interview with Sofia Hator

ED: Good afternoon everybody. Welcome to Today's Witch Magazine interview with Sophia Hator, and she's the author of several Goddess books that she's written. The first book I spotted was on...what was it?

Sofia: No, it's Awakening.

ED: Awakening the God, the goddess Lilith. That's it. Lilith.

Sofia: yes.

ED: Okay, well first of all, I'd like to ask you a couple questions like what are your current craft practices and what got you on the path?

Sofia: They're very good questions. So my current practices, I'm very much an energy girl, so I do a lot of meditation.

And I do a lot of, in the moment, intuitive kind of energy thing, so it can be very spontaneous. It sort of just comes from within. Then it can involve things like you know, movement or even noise. That's a more recent thing. But my daily practice is meditation. And a bit of candle work and meditation, and then spontaneous bits throughout the day as they arise.

ED: So you declare yourself basically an eclectic?

Sofia: Yeah, to be honest, I don't really have a name for myself. I just, in the beginning when I was young, I used to think of myself as a witch. And then as I've. Aged and then found the goddess path. I kind of associated myself with priestess and now high priestess which sort of came through intuitively when I had this huge spiritual awakening in 2020.

That was just kind of what was on a different level and so now I'm learning all these others. The words like chaos, witch and things like that. And I kind of resonate with a lot of them in different ways, so I'm not too sure. So eclectic sounds right.

ED: Very good. Now you've been writing books on goddesses and you particularly started off with Lilith. What, uh, drove you to write about Lilith first?

Sofia: Well, they're channeled books. It was a lived experience of her coming through. Throughout the book I show pieces of that. So she came in many, many ways. Obviously in meditation a lot. I communicate there. Then in my lived experience it comes up and it's almost like a process I have to go through in various ways.

But sometimes it can be really fun as well. So I remember when I started writing that book, the movie, the new movie Wicked came out, you know, the new one with the, the green character and the pink character. And so Lilith very much to me, I could see it in that green character. I was just like, yes, that's, yeah.

So it's like that it's very much becoming my reality.

ED: Now you're currently, I noticed, working on another one on Aphrodite, I believe.

Sofia: Yeah, I am. I'm nearly finished.

ED: That is an interesting, dichotomy of a sort, because Lilith has always been considered a dark goddess or chrome goddess of the sort, you know, and then here you go.

Lilith being a chrome dark goddess and a chaos goddess to Aphrodite who was the total opposite and goddess of love, beauty, and poetry.

Sofia: Totally. So it's one extreme to the other. Yeah. And do you know what, it wasn't my choice. It came through and when she came through after, it was probably about a month after I'd released the Awakening Lilith one.

I was in the ocean at the time and I started thinking, oh, what is this energy like, you know, and started seeing signs of that kind of channeling experience coming through and that connection. And a few weeks into it, I picked out different goddesses. When I just went, okay, just tell me, and I drew out the Aphrodite card, I was like, yeah, oh no, it can't be Aphrodite 'cause that's not my usual.

And I just missed it. Yeah, but it came back around. It was definitely Aphrodite and the book uncovers a lot of, well, to be honest, I brought into the archetypal, what do we call it? The impression of that. She is just a beautiful figure. I think I was holding onto that and I've discovered. I put a lot more about her as being more of a creator of the world.

So yeah, it's been a journey.

ED: Well, she is a very interesting goddess. I, I must agree. I personally am Alexandrian and Wiccan. But with a Norse background, I tend towards Freyja and Tyr personally. Yeah. But, I've noticed that when you do your books on the goddesses, right. And I'm looking forward to getting a copy of your first one on Lilith, because I've always been fascinated with her.

Sofia: Yeah, I'll send you one.

ED: Oh, nice. I'll remember you to give you my address at the end of this. But, yeah.

Anyway, one of the things I've not, I've noticed is. Now when you do work with a God and Goddess in the archetypal principles, what, what type of experiences do you have with them? What type of things do you note with them? I know, 'cause you probably directly channel their energies and Connect with them in it. What were your experiences with them?

Sofia: It was very much about creating boundaries with the things I wanted. In order for me to create the boundary around myself to create what I'm wanting, I also had to travel. Travel through some fear, and I actually had some real experiences of, like I hurt my back and then I had to kind of process some, do some healing and shadow work through that to get to where I want.

It sort of, it activates I would say, a multidimensional layer within my being. And then it can pull me into lots of different things. I also had family issues come out that were very Lilith and confronting and I had to walk through them. But at the same time, because I'm working with the goddess, I just, I can kind of settle into it and almost be an observer.

Perhaps this is a perfect experience to show you.

The experiences are all different sorts of experience, like going to see and then just being like, oh my gosh, I'm, I'm here writing this book of Lilith and here it is in this movie form, which was fun and empowering and just really speaks to that.

An archetype of coming into your power and standing up for what you believe in and following your own pathway. And then it can be like a real experience of being with family members that, and things go wrong and, and just sort of witnessing lots of, you know, a hardcore energy come through and sort of just for me it was in this particular experience, not going into too much detail, but it was just witnessing it.

Pulling away from boundaries around it. It can be like that as well. And then I do channeling things when writing the book, the information comes through. I'm writing and I'm learning as well at the same time. 'cause I don't often know what I'm writing until I'm writing it. I don't know.

Sofia: Ah, you, you know, you asked me the, the, how do I experience it, and I was just thinking this is an exact. Perfect example, you know, things so come that are unexpected and we just go through them.

ED: Well now when you channel a deity, I know I've done it myself and numerous times.

I want to channel gods and goddesses at various levels, especially Gods because of the fact I am male of course. Channeling the gods is a, I found my experiences have been kind of strange at times because like I channeled Pan once,

Sofia: Right? That would be fun.

ED: I'll never do that again.

That was not fun for me, but fun for my coven. Have you found when you channel a God, a guardian God, so you invite them in there and them. Have you found the goddesses, being very strong in her message to you and stuff like that...

Sofia: I find that, to be honest, I only just, I didn't even know I was channeling I until I just thought I was automatic writing in the Lilith book.

I thought I was just writing and I mean, I knew, I was having communion and things like that 'cause that's always been normal and present. But only recently I've learned that it's a form, form of clairvoyance and that kind of writing and it and then the sort of that feeling of yes, I can bring it through, has come through.

So it's kind of new for me to think of it this way. I can notice the more I'm doing. 'cause now I'm on the second book. I know, and I've written it down in there, there is a strong impression, like I'm getting impressed strongly. Like, it's like a definite, you know, this is what I want to say, kind of thing.

Yes, it's more of a feeling. So again, I work with energy, so what does it feel like? It feels like, yeah, like a push in a way. Like an internal push. Like there's more energy behind it. Yeah. Thrusting forward.

ED: Right. Well, the next question for you is in your, in your practice of the craft.

Of course. I know in personal experience that there's been times when there's not been acceptance and other times where there's been a lot of acceptance of my practices and mostly because of the fact I was raised in it. I had the advantage of being craft from the time I was eight years old, to now.

How is your support wise from your family, from your friends, and are you in a broom closet or are you out of the closet? So to speak.

Sofia: Awesome question, because this is something I think about a lot now, so I've always been interested in the craft. I remember being in my first year of high school and we were allowed for the first time ever to do our own assignment on whatever we wanted, and I remember going to get the witch books out and sitting there and writing them out.

I don't ask myself how that assignment ended, but that's what I was interested in or all the way back then. I remember then later on when I. I was like in my final years of high school saying to my mum, we were picking up one of my siblings, one day, and I was back in the days before GPS was looking in the index of the street names and I went, oh! There's Witch Street.

And I remember my mum saying, don't be ridiculous. There's no such thing as witches. And I was like, yes, there is. So, I just backed off. But when I became, you know, a young adult and entered out into the world. I very quickly found my very first spiritual teacher, when I was about 19. That's when the goddess path came. She was a high priestess and then I just connected so deeply.

It was a mixture of witchcraft and all this kind of high priestess kind of learning together. So once I found that I had a tribe around me all the time, and I stuck that out for like 10 years...that would've been about 10 years. And then I went overseas to Glastonbury, to the Goddess Temple and did more studies.

I've always had the tribe around me and got very used to that. Recently, in the last few years, I've never really brought it out in the open much apart from, you know, the mention of the goddess here and there with my husband and yoga. But his sister all of a sudden, a few years ago was like, I'm a witch, just like that.

And then the mom was like, yeah, I'm gonna be a witch too. So there's this huge door open for me. To bring it out at the same time as I, then I, maybe it influenced me being able to come out of the broom closet within my family and not just my circles. And that's where the books started coming through. It makes sense in a timeline.

Now we, me and, and my sister-in-law and my mother-in-law, we go to witch festivals and things like that, so it's totally different. There is a little bit of fear still with putting it out into the masses in the books. Yeah, pretty much out of the broom closet, but just new, newly out.

ED: So you have a, you have an excellent support system when it comes to it. Then in regards to the, you know, family support and your husband and everything else having, basically having your back saying, you know, yeah, she's a witch, It's a good thing.

Sofia: It's a long time coming.

ED: Exactly. Now you've probably, you've obviously been practicing a while now, you know, in the craft. And I'm sure you've seen some of the growth and progress we've seen in the craft practitioners as witchcraft practitioners over the course of the many years. I mean, like every 15 years we have an influx of new witches coming out with the woodwork, including your sister-in-law and your mother-in-law, you know?

Yeah. Do you find that there's a lot of positivity to the growth or do you find there sometimes there's a lot of misinformation and a lot of things that aren't really there. I know you've done your homework on, you know, on craft back when you were in high school of course and learning first, learning craft.

I know you did a lot of homework. Have you found there's a lot of misconceptions regarding crafting our practices or have you found that, you know, with new TikTok, witches and all this.

Sofia: Yeah, I have to say it's been a while since I went to a witchy thing, and when I went to the last witch festival, which was the first one I'd done in like 10 years, I'd just been practicing solo.

I was impressed. The stuff that was there impressed me and 'cause it, it just had that energetic resonance of those, the people doing that. And there were lots of workshops going on. They were connected. I could see that. Vibratory connection and that higher level, practice. They were all different. But I was really impressed, um, in saying that I have only ever experienced one person who I've directly said my things to who went, no, you're full of bs.

There is definitely still resistance out there and I'm sure there's much more. I just don't connect with it so I don't have to experience it. It's a lot, but in the practices that I've seen recently of what other people are doing. It makes me feel very happy because it is not just routine structural stuff, it's actually coming from a place of I believe, from what I can see, is they're connecting with their higher selves.

ED: Okay. I've experienced both sides of that coin. That's why I was asking that question because I've experienced both sides of the coin from the higher connectivity to the lower end of, rote learning and rote memory of books that aren't even written correctly, that have so much misinformation that we have to guide them back.

Back into the right way or path. Luckily, you were from, I noticed you're from Australia, you said, and I know you traveled to England often being that you traveled to England and everything and you were, Glastonbury I know was in England and Scotland rather. Surrey, Surrey's up in Scotland?

Sofia: No, in England.

ED: Okay. I was right. Been a while.

Sofia: You must go again.

ED: I know. I must. One of these days I will get the opportunity to travel again that far, hopefully.

I know the birthplace of witchcraft is basically England and that when it comes to modern witchcraft, because you had Gerald Gardner and Doreen Valiente and then later Alex Sanders.

That and then Ray Buckland bringing it into the United States from his perspective. I can see there would be a difference in the way you would perceive it than some of the stuff I see in the US today, but the internet is what I'm talking about. More, less anything else. Internet.

Sofia: I know for sure and this probably serves as a warning maybe for, for those who are interested in reading materials to be, to be very mindful of. I have seen, 'cause I'm in book writing, how to write and get your books out there, their clubs.

I have seen people talk about taking witchcraft and writing a book on it. They are not witches, which is...that's a very sad thing. So I just wanted to put that out there. I have seen that. Definitely insure whether it's a real one or not.

ED: Yeah, well that's what I was referring to.

There's a lot of, you know, false information and misinformation and, and that being written from several people, and I'm not gonna mention names of some of them, some of the authors, but there are many. Who are not true practitioners. And then there's some of us that are, that have been in the craft for a long time.

I, too, am an author by the way, and a writer.

Sofia: You're an author.

ED: I'm an author and a writer.

Sofia: You have to send me your links to your book because I would, yeah.

ED: I'll actually send you a copy of my first manuscript. You'll enjoy it.

Sofia: Yay, Thank you.

ED: You'll enjoy it immensely. Being a writer, what are some of the challenges you've faced in that aspect of things too, in writing?

Sofia: Well for me it was confidence first. So, In the beginning, like now it feels so natural. In the beginning, I felt like I had to get help, which is totally a dogma thing. Like I just brought into the fact that I needed, you know, other writers to tell me how to structure it and all these sorts of things.

But actually since I grew my confidence that I'm writing from spirit. And from my own personal experience, it's being received so much better. So that's one thing. The other thing about writing is, writing is only half the journey. If you, if you want to get your books out there. Now this is my part of my high priestess path, it's that coming, that full circle teaching back around as I get older.

So when, if you want to get your books out there, you have to do media. That's another journey in itself. And right now for me, I have. My spiritual name and my other name and, and, and I'm in the phase probably over the next, I don't know from how I see it in my vision without thinking too much.

It's like emerging back into the one, you know? So that's tricky for me because it feels like I don't want to be separate like that. It's, I want to just be the one, so there's that other side of it too. I'm sorry I didn't explain that real well, but yeah.

ED: Well, I can understand that because as a writer, sometimes people use their actual, regular names, like in my case I do.

Some people use their pseudonym or pen name. Integrating that, those two aspects sometimes can be difficult because you're wearing different hats for different things. Yeah.

I got introduced to you through your pen name, therefore, you know, I'm gonna of course refer you as Sophia because of the fact that that's how I know you.

Sofia: Can I tell you what my medicine name is? So this was given in a meditation and it was so fire, Laughing Mountain.

Sophia, that's what it means. I was like, yeah, that's right. That's what it'll be.

ED: That's interesting. So anyway, we're running short on time. Where can we find your books? That's the next question I need,

Sofia: Like I don't preprint them or anything like that. You just go onto Amazon and look up Sophia Hator, H-A -T-O-R and you'll find them on there. And the new one's gonna be coming out soon.

ED: I'm looking forward to seeing it and I'll be happy to put it on my website 'cause you'll also be able to find her books on my website.

Remembering the Sacred Story: The 2nd Insight and the Second Rose Petal

Chrissy Dunham interview with Edward Sott of Covered Bridge Press

ED: Okay, welcome everybody to Today's Witch Magazine interview with Chrissy and Chris Dunham. It's my pleasure to have them both here. They're Stregaria and I believe followers of Aradia. So, without further ado, let me, let me have them introduce themselves and we again welcome you.

Chrissy: Hi everyone. for having us. My name is Chrissy and this is Chris. In the Pagan community in Iowa and Colorado, we go by Thunder and Gypsy for years, but now it's just Chris and Chrissy.

ED: Okay. Now, do you guys have a working coven or a church or a group?

Chrissy: Yes, we do. We started out as a coven in the 90s. In the late 90s, we called ourselves Coven of the Blessed Lady. Because the lady kind of gave us a blessing with the spiritual family. That is a coven. Over the years, we have sister covens now.

We've got three sister covens. One of the covens Covenant, the Sacred Lady. It's only like two hours from us and they are very, very active in the community and teaching as well. And then we had another coven, about three hours from us and one from five hours from us. So the priest and priestesses of those covens are just carrying on our teachings.

ED: Excellent. And what are some of the differences? I'm familiar with a lot of neopagan traditions and I'm wondering what are some of the differences that you have found between your practices and that of other neopagan practices?

Chrissy: Really, to me, there's not like not much difference. Sometimes we can be a little more elaborate than others, but we also like to have fun.

With some covens, tradition is very, very serious. We are serious, but we still like to have fun. We like to be silly too because the gods are looking down on you and think, Oh, you guys are silly. You guys are funny to watch. You know, I didn't like that.

ED: Well, it does say, it does say I know in some old craft tradition, celebrate me with mirth and joy.

Chris: Yeah.

ED: Back then I believe that was written in the book of Aradia.

Chris: Yeah. The big thing between neo-paganism versus hereditary or lineage traditions is that we keep the structures that were handed down to us through the ages versus neo-paganism is more what I would call more modern witchcraft.

Where they're trying to reconstruct all their, you know, their spirituality upon the base of witchcraft. But there is a difference because we're working upon what I would call Elder magic versus what they see today. That stems from Gerald Gardner and I'm not saying that they're wrong, they're very much right, but we have to realize that our traditions haven't been broken.

ED: Now, in your tradition, particular tradition, do you have a degree system that you work with? Like in a lot of traditions, we work with a degree system where you work from seeker to initiate to first, second, and third degree. Do you have that similar basis?

Chris: Within our Covenstead, we have the people go through three different stages, initiations.

But if you look at the old tradition, There's only one, one initiation.

ED: Well, I can agree and disagree. Well, yeah, there is only one initiation and that is your dedication to the god and goddess. I will say that. I'll agree with that.

ED: But I noticed, I know Instructor Coven, the reason for the degree system is much like that of a tribal family situation.

Chris: Yes.

ED: Like the first degree, your initiative or seeker. I mean, you're not even an issue. Your seeker is like a newborn child born into the womb of the goddess. Just coming into the light doesn't understand then you go to the first degree.

Chris: Yeah.

ED: Yeah. Yeah.

Chris: But where I was making that difference of one degree, it's more for the hereditary family tradition through birthright.

They already are linked to the goddess. They already have the ancient wisdom within their bloodline that flows through them versus more modern witchcraft practice. We have the three initiations. Those are very important. Dedication, your initiation, first degree, your second degree, and your third degree.

Chrissy: Once you get to your third degree, you know, I mean, you can stay with the covenant if you want, or you can go out on your own. I mean, we have that free will, you know, stay if you will, go if you must, anytime you want to. So, if they want to stay with us, they can. If they want to go off on their own, they can.

Only thing we ask is to always have that friendship with us. That's it.

ED: Well, I can agree with that in a lot of ways, what you're saying is true. I come from an Alexandrian working tradition myself. I'm an Alexandrian. Okay, and we do follow a degree system and the reason we do so is not so much of a hereditation or hereditary aspect, it's because of the amount of time it takes to learn the craft and understand the craft because you're always learning it. You never stop learning the craft. The day you stop learning the craft is the day you pass from this world into the next one and you're still learning.

Chrissy: Many lifetimes. Yes.

ED: Because I know we face challenges over the course of the years with the rise in paganism and the decline of paganism and it's a both. It goes in a fluctuation cycle. Every 15 years we get an influx of new pagans coming out of the woodwork.

Chrissy: Yeah.

ED: What would be? Some of the challenges I'd say that you keep, that you have run into because of this.

Chrissy: Oh, wow. That's a good question because it's a, each group, each Coven has their own challenges, as you know. I think it is one of our biggest. I think one of the biggest challenges is

Chris: patience

Chrissy: Of the students because some students want to come in and they want their degree right now. You know, they don't want to go through the system.

They want to come in and they want you to give them a silver spoon. They don't really want to do the homework. They just want to participate and say, Hey, I'm a witch and that's it. You know, and that's, that's really tough because it takes more than that. You do have some training. Some just go through the degree system.

You just cannot walk into a coven and say, "okay, I want my, you know, first, second, third degree within six months" because it's not going to happen. There's too many lessons in between over the years that you have to learn.

ED: The first lesson is to know thyself.

Chrissy: Right. And that's what we do because we do like a science part of it for the first, for the first half or the first part.

Well, you know thyself, you know what you're getting into, you know, what it means for witchcraft and everything. You do have to know the history too, as well, and you have to get to know yourself, your ancestors, everything to help you on your path.

Then we have the arts. You have to learn candle magic, what's your sabbaths and everything like that. You know, your full moons, how to do that. And then you work on your magic, which is the last part into different rituals, like hand fasting, last rites, coming of age, as well as your other sabbaths and moon phases too.

ED: Well, that's why I was explaining why I say that, you know, the degree system is important because the degree system. The ones that do the coming of age are very much the same thing. I said, you gotta put your initiative into your teenage years. That's coming of age into teenagers Yep, 13 to 16.

You go to a first degree from 16 to 19. You're learning about your family, the family structure and everything and how to become a family. Then you get that fatherhood and motherhood, the importance of that. Then you go further into your mother and fatherhood And then you go into your crony and staging or your elder, your grandfather's rights. Now go back where you have to teach the tribe and continue moving forward. And that's your third degree right there.

Chrissy: Yeah.

ED: So yes, it falls under the same right of passage that you're talking about.

Chrissy: Yeah. Well I'm talking about, you should know how to do your rituals and everything.

Okay. And, but when I say when they do the coming of age. I'm talking about the specific rights like coming of age, handfasting, wiccany...

ED: Oh yeah, that's what I'm referring to. Even the degree system falls under the same principle.

Chrissy: And we always make sure they know that to have them write their own. So we can look it over and say, yep, you did a good job. Or, you know, elaborate on this more or whatever.

ED: I do a similar thing with my students in Coven. I'll have them actually starting from a simple basic ritual all the way to a complex ritual, which a complex ritual includes everything. They have to include every chant, every ringing of the bell, every response, every set up of the altar, the whole shebang.

Chrissy: Yeah. And you know, we also teach our students that if you attend an event... because we have done 27 years of public events in lowa and Colorado. We teach our students as well. If somebody comes up to you and says, "Oh, I need an element to be, you know, can you do air? Can you do earth? Can you do the center or something?"

You know, "Oh, I need a priestess or a priest. I need help." We try to make our students able to adapt to all the paths that they can. So we do want them to learn not everything, but just a little bit about how each path can do their circle and stuff in case they get asked to help out.

ED: That's a good point. And in today's society, you brought up the fact that you have your challenges being the immediate gratification.

Chris: Yeah.

ED: Yeah. I want to be a third degree before they even reach the point where they're a seeker yet.

Chrissy: Yeah, that's true.

ED: Where they don't even know what they're looking for.

I faced that too. I've seen that with, back in the nineties with the movie, The Craft. I know your eyes rolled too. Mine, I remember that day all too well. Between that and the Teen Witch book written by Silver Ravenwolf, coming out at the same time. We had a massive influx of , what I like to call people playing at paganism, Before they even had set before they even knew what was going on.

Chrissy: Yeah

ED: Again with the computer age.

Chrissy: Yeah

ED: The TicToc Witch

Chris: You know what I call it is a lot of people when they come into the craft. They're going to have to check their egos and they're going to have to learn to relate to deities that they don't know. They forget that just like me and you. We talked a little bit, we had to build that relationship and that's the way it should be when we step into the path.

You have to check the ego. And build a relationship with your god.

ED: God. Goddess, right? Agreed. Totally. Totally agreed. Well, we're coming up on a 15 minute market. I normally close around 15 minutes. So, we'll go on to twenty but because I have a couple more questions to ask. What is your view or vision of the future coming up for the craft?

Do you think we're heading in a positive direction or do we have to return back to traditionalism?

Chrissy: Well, this is kind of like a, you're going to get a different answer from both of us. Because for me, I think the craft is coming into its power more. I think a lot of people are starting to come to the path or want to experience it.

I think it's more accepted in some areas, a lot more than it was like 10, 20 years ago. I see good things coming to the crop. I know there's some others that are scared to death of what's going on in the country and everything, but you know, if you just stick together, stick to your guns. Don't let no one take your beliefs away because they are your beliefs. They can take away your house, your car, sometimes they can take away your kids, but your beliefs, that's inside of you, it's inside your soul, they cannot take that away.

You, on the other hand, have to stay strong. That's what you have to do. Now I know his thoughts, it's a little bit different than mine.

Chris: I mean, I permanently believe in keeping the structure. That was handed down from our ancestors, more of a traditional sense, but I also realized that for us to grow, that our times are changing, that we should experience more of a spiritual sense of reaching out to the goddess in a stronger mindset as a collective.

These two things are very important. Why should we dismiss what was done and structurized thousands of years ago? To feed our ego. We have to let go of our ego and keep that traditional sense and move forward as a united front of which we have to become one, not in the sense of, Oh, you know, we're speaking of becoming one religion.

I'm speaking in a sense of letting our spirituality reign as individuals. You know, it's like a lot of people don't realize that, yeah, I've, I've been taught within a coven structure. I've had some wonderful, wonderful teachers, but I'm also a solitary witch. Why can't we have both? Why can't we be like the eagle who flies through the sky?

Very important

ED: Well, I thank you both very much for allowing me to interview you, and I look forward to publishing it in the future. I'm going to ask that you both stick around, as you know, because I have to download the recording and everything, and it's going to be time for that. So I'd like to say if there's any parting words from either one of you for the leadership or audience.

Chrissy: The only thing I can say now is that we don't do much leadership in the community, but we do have a Facebook group called "Within the Cauldron," that is kind of like a study group with questions. Of the chats that we have that's very active and along with that we have the "Within the Quadrant" YouTube that we podcast each week on.

So we are still serving the community, but in a different way.

ED: Well, thank you again both of you. Thanks everybody for allowing me to give you this interview and our magazine. We look forward to having more interviews in the future in the magazine. And. We look forward to your readership. So kindly, please, uh, please continue reading the magazine. Subscribe to us and enjoy the content because there's a lot of good information in this.

Beltane's Flame-Grilled Stuffed Peppers

- ~ 1 teaspoon smoked paprika (for fire's transformative power and Beltane's sacred flames
- ~ ½ teaspoon chili flakes (optional)- (for passion and warmth)
- ~ Salt & black pepper, to taste (for purification, grounding, and balance)
- ~ ½ cup feta cheese or vegan alternative (optional) (for nourishment and the sacred feminine)

Directions

- 1. Set the Intentions: Preheat your grill (or oven to 400°F/200°C). As the grill heats, visualize them fueling your passion, creativity, and transformation.
- 2. Brush the halved bell peppers with olive oil and lightly sprinkle with salt and black pepper. Place them on a grill or baking sheet, cut side up.

Amulets and Talismans are very powerful magickal tools for achieving change in your life.

Talismans work by generating a positive force thereby drawing the desired result to you through the Law of Attraction. Amulets, on the other hand, provide protection by deflecting negative energies thus creating a protective barrier around your space. Unlike most other forms of magick, a correctly charged Amulet or Talisman will work even if its wearer initially has no belief in its powers. When empowered correctly, both work like self-charging solar batteries and function in a way that links them with the appropriate planetary or energetic forces in line with their intention.

Magickal energy is then continually channeled through to the objective as more energy is attracted from the Cosmos.

The ancient symbols used in the construction of some Amulets and Talismans pre-date the Christian era and yet they are as potent and effective today as they were at the time of their original construction. Many Talismans, like the ones from King Solomon, have historic roots stemming from the Qabalah over 3,000 years ago. King Solomon's teachings form one of the cornerstones of Western Magick. Talismans based on King Solomon's designs are very powerful, and their effects will often be felt very quickly.

CHARGING YOUR AMULET OR TALISMAN

To get the maximum benefit from your Amulet or Talisman it is advisable to form a link between yourself and the planetary forces that will operate through it by charging it. Experienced occultists may prefer to use one of the many Qabalistic, Golden Dawn or Wiccan rituals that have been designed specifically for this purpose. However the Ritual of Empowerment we give here is simple, safe and extremely effective and requires no magickal experience. If you bought your Talisman or Amulet to help you change an aspect of your life, rather than simply because it's an attractive fashion accessory, we strongly recommend you perform this ritual – you may well be surprised by the results!

SUPPLIES YOU WILL NEED


Glass of Water, White Candle (or a candle of a color that corresponds with your desire or intent), Few Pinches of Salt, White Cloth, Small Side Table or Coffee Table, Stick of Incense (Sandalwood or a scent that corresponds with the desire or intent of the working), and a Quiet Room

RITUAL OF EMPOWERMENT FOR YOUR AMULET OR TALISMAN

- Make sure that you will be undisturbed in your room or sacred space. Take the telephone
 off the hook, shut the drapes, lock the door, put out a "Do Not Disturb" sign.
- 2. Lay your white cloth over the cleared, clean table and place your candle in the center of the table and light it. (Remember to never leave a lit candle unattended and be sure that it is not close to anything that could catch on fire.) Light your stick of incense, put it in a safe holder and place it on your table. Place your glass of water, salt and the new Amulet or Talisman on the table in front of the other items.
- **3**. Turn off the lights, close your eyes and spend 5 minutes thinking about exactly what your would like your Talisman to achieve. Magick works far better on specific objectives than generalities. So for example if your Talisman is for ambition/success then visualize the job you would like to get and SEE yourself in that position, having achieved your new job, sitting in your new office.
- **4.** Take a pinch of salt and sprinkle it slowly into the water, visualizing the water being filled with a golden light and say: "WITH THIS SALT I CONSECRATE THIS WATER, MAY WHATEVER IT TOUCHES BE HALLOWED WITH LIGHT."
- 5. Sprinkle a drop of water onto your Talisman and say: "WITH THIS SACRED WATER I CONSECRATE THIS TALISMAN SO THAT IT MAY...(state your intention)."
- **6.** Pass the Talisman through the smoke of the incense and say: "WITH THIS BURNING INCENSE I PURIFY THIS TALISMAN SO THAT IT MAY...(state your intention)."
- 7. Pass the Talisman through the flame of the candle saying: "WITH THIS SACRED FLAME I CLEANSE THIS TALISMAN SO THAT IT MAY...(state your intention)."
- 8. Sit down and close your eyes and hold your Talisman in your right hand. Imagine above you a sphere of brilliant white light approximately a foot in diameter radiating in all directions. Concentrate your energy on this sphere and see a shaft of white light penetrating into the top of your head. Imagine this gradually moving down to your neck where it forms a second sphere of silver blue light around your throat. The light slowly flows down your body until it reaches your solar plexus where it forms a huge golden sphere. You feel warm and powerful, invigorated by this cosmic light. Now with all the energy in your being, see this golden light move through your body and into the Talisman. At the same time picture again, very clearly, the vision you built up of your Talisman successfully working.

The Dictionary of Pagan Terms

S Words

Sabbat:A holy day of the seasonal cycle of the Sun and Earth. There are eight: the lesser Sabbats are the two equinoxes and the two solstices. The greater Sabbats are the holidays that fall half-way in between, or at the cross quarters. See also Wheel of the Year. 2The name given to the eight great festivals of the year, celebrating the movement of the sun through the sky, the turn of the seasons. 3A Wiccan religious festival.

See, Beltane, Imbolc, Lughnasadh, Mabon, Midsummer, Ostara, Samhain, and Yule for specific descriptions. 4The eight seasonal festivals celebrated by witches and by many others. In order through the calendar year, they are: Imbolg (q.v) 2 February; Spring Equinox 21 March; Bealtaine (q.v) 30 April; Midsummer Solstice 22 June; Lughnasadh (q.v) 31 July; Autumn Equinox 21 September; Samhain (q.v) 31 October; and the Winter Solstice or Yule (q.v) 22 December. Imbolg, Bealtaine, Lughnasadh and Samhain are known as the Greater Sabbats, and the Solstices and Equinoxes are the Lesser Sabbats. The dates for observing the Lesser Sabbats may vary slightly in different traditions, and the actual dates of the Equinoxes and Solstices do vary, by a day at most, from year to year in astronomical fact. 5One of the holy days of the Wiccan religion, celebrating themes such as birth, fertility and death, related to the turning of the seasons. Most Wiccan traditions celebrate eight sabbats. They have more than one name each, bot one set goes as follows: Yule, Imbolg, Ostara, Beltane, Litha, Lughnassad, Mabon, and Samhain. 6One of the eight seasonal festivals of the Wiccan year.

Sachet: A cloth bag filled with herbs. In herb magick sachets are used to contain herb mixtures while they slowly release their energies for specific magickal goals.

Sacred Space: Any region in which the power of the elements have been called upon to protect and guide whatever is happening within that space. In considering what constitutes true sacred space, remember this: Sacredness is determined as much by attitude as action.(see also Magick Circle).

Salamander: The traditional name for an Elemental (q.v) spirit of the nature of the Fire element.

Salt: Used in many magickal procedures, including Wiccan, as a kind of spiritual antiseptic, or purifying symbol.² In ritual, salt is both a symbolic element of Earth and a cleansing agent, especially when mixed with water.

Samhain: A Wiccan festival celebrated on October 31st , also known as November Eve, Hallowmas, Halloween, Feast of Souls, Feast of the Dead, Feast of Apples. Samhain marks the symbolic death of the Sun God and His passing into the "land of the

young" where He awaits rebirth of the Mother Goddess at Yule. This Celtic word is pronounced by Wiccans as: SOW-wen; SEW-wen; SAHM-hain; SAMH-ain; SAV-een and other ways. The first seems to be the one preferred among most Wiccans. 2The Hallowe'en Great Sabbat, celebrated on 31 October. In Celtic tradition, it is the start of the new year, and also of winter - Bealtaine (q.v) being the beginning of summer; the pastoral Celts only recognized two seasons. Samhain is particularly associated with the contacting of dead friends. The origin of the words seem uncertain, though it may relate to the Gaelic verb sámhaim, 'to quiet down, become silent'. 3Ancient Irish fires festival honoring the dead. One of the eight sabbats of the Wiccan year. Celebrated on October 31.

Scourge: This consists of several strands of light cord attached to a handle; some traditions require a token scourging as part of initiation, to ritually purify the candidate or induce trance.

Scribe a Circle: The act of drawing a protective circle, literally or figuratively, in a room to prepare the sacred space.

Scrying: To gaze into something in order to gain insight or psychic impressions. The obvious example of "something" is a crystal ball, but there are many other tools for scrying -- black mirrors, pools of still water, water in a dark bowl, flames, cloud formations ²Discerning images in a crystal that reveal the future or secrets of the past or present.³ To gaze at or into and object (a quartz crystal sphere, pools of water, reflections, a candle flame) to still the Conscious Mind and to contact the Psychic Mind. This allows the scryer to become aware of possible events prior to their actual occurrence, as well as previous or distant, simultaneous events through other than normally accepted senses. A form of Divination. (4) Any form of divination which involves gazing at or into something (crystal ball, black mirror, pool of ink etc.) to induce psychically perceived visual images.(5) Divination by means of gazing into a dark reflective surface.(6) The word scrying comes from an Old English word meaning "discover" and it's used to describe a type of divination. Here a person looks at the flames of a fire, the surface of a crystal, a reflective surface, or the like, and watches for specific visions to appear. Many students of this art believe the intense staring leads to self-induced trance states that heighten awareness so the symbolic imagery can appear for interpretation.

Sefirah: (Plural: sefiroth) One of ten aspects of God revealed during the creation of the universe and represented in the Kabbalistic Sefiroth, or Tree of Life.

So Mote It Be: The way most rituals, prayers, etc. are ended in magick circles. Like the Christian "Amen", meaning "So be it" or "So must it be".

Sorcerer, Sorceress: An enchanter, usually with inborn and undisciplined powers.

Soul Group: A cluster of souls who are in incarnation.

Soul Links: The connections between members of a soul group.

Soul-Mates: Individuals (q.v) who are continuously involved with each other in successive Incarnations (q.v), becoming rather like a pair of binary stars. Also known as twin souls.

Soul Retrieval: Trauma, shock or abuse can cause a part of the soul energy to leave and remain "stuck". A soul retrieval practitioner or shaman retrieves the soul, bringing it back to the physical body or , temporarily, to a crystal.

Spell: A clearly focused intent that is directed through a ritual raising of energy. ²A magickal rite, usually nonreligious in nature, and often accompanied by spoken words. ³The mainstay of Folk Magick, spells are simply magickal rites. They're usually non-religious and often include spoken words. ³A pattern or series of words and/or actions performed with magickal intent; or sometimes simply a spoken incantation. A spell may be part of a ritual, but may also be performed without the usual ritual steps: casting the circle, calling the quarters, invoking Deity and so on.(4) A mini-ritual in which magick is raised and directed toward a specific goal.

Spin-Off: A ritual in which one leaves the circle with which one has trained in order to form a new circle. Also called Hiving.

Spiral Dance: Refers to the "dance" of life, seen as a never-ending spiral. Also refers to an actual circle dance in which a group holds hands in a chain, spiraling inward to the center of the circle and out again, often snaking in and out in the process, but never dropping hands.

Spirit Guides: Discarnate souls who work from between-lives state to provide assistance to those on earth.

Spirits of the Stones, The: The elemental energies naturally inherent at the four directions of the magick circle, personified within the "Standing Stones Tradition" as the "Spirits of the Stones". They are linked with the Elements.

Spiritualist: Once who believes that the dead can communicate with the living, especially through a medium or channel.

Staff: A Witch's staff can be a ritual tool or Fire or Air, or symbolize the masculine energy of the God. They are sometimes used as hiking sticks, and sometimes in ritual. The kind of wood used and the carvings and decorations are usually symbolic of energies important to the owner.

Stang: A forked stick placed in the center of the circle, as a primitive symbol of the Horned God or other deity being invoked.

Stones: Rocks and gems are used for healing, divination, talismans, and other magickal purposes.Lodestone (magnetite) and quartz crystals are two commonly used stones, but many others are used as well.

Subliminal: Literally "below the threshold"; from Liebniz onwards, applied to experiences which enter the psyche without coming into con-

sciousness, and can result in overt action still without themselves becoming conscious.

Subtle Bodies: The layers of the biomagnetic sheath that relate to the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual levels of being.

Subtle Energy Field: The invisible but detectable energy field that surrounds all living beings.

Succubus: A female spirit or demon once believed to sexually tempt and abuse men.. It may have been a theological explanation of nocturnal emissions. Compare with Incubus.

Summerlands: A spiritualist word for the Heaven which souls enter after death. Often used by believes in Reincarnation (q.v) to denote the astral stage of rest after physical death, before the Individuality (q.v) withdraws from all the lower levels to prepare for its next Incarnation (q.v). ² The Wiccan concept of the afterlife, where spirits rest in the company of the Lady and Lord, reflect on what they have learned in their most recent incarnation, and prepare for the next one. Witches do not believe in heaven, hell, or purgatory, but only in the Summerland. (3) The dwelling place of spirits after death.

Sun Magick: Pertaining to the masculine attributes, any fire-based magicks or any ritual that marks the passage of the Sun through the sky, such as a solstice (when the sun is farthest from the equator). In comparison, and equinox is usually celebrates as a Moon or midnight festival. The sun has attributes of leadership, strength, etc.

Sunward: Clockwise, usually referring to the movement around a circle in dance. Meant to mimic the motions of the heavens and bring positive energy to the working.

Sword: One of the four elemental tools, representing the Fire Element - or in some traditions the Air element. ² A ritual tool of Air or Fire, used in ritual to cast the circle. Most often individual Witches will own athames, and the coven may own a sword. It is also a masculine symbol; a priestess who wears a sword may take the part of a priest, in some traditions.

Sylph: The traditional name for an Elemental(q.v) spirit of the nature of the Air element.

Symbol: An image that represents something else.

Symbol System: A symbolic "map" of reality that represents the fundamental aspects of our emotional and spiritual experience and can be used as a means of exploring and developing the spiritual self.

Synchronicity: Jung's term for 'meaningful coincidence', an acausal connection principle for which he brought forward much evidence. His discussion of the subject is of great interest to all occultists.

Synthetic "Essential" Oils: Those fragrant oils which have not been obtained by steam distillation or cold expression from the naturally aromatic plant materials after which they are named. Synthetic scents are useless in both magickal aromatherapy and its conventional cousin and shouldn't be used for these purposes under any circumstances. Compare with Essential oils.

Sefiroth: The Tree of Life, the most familiar symbol of the Kabbalah. The Sefiroth graphically sets out the stages of God's manifestation and the relationships that underlie the whole of existence and creation. Each point on the Tree is associated with a Sefirah, whence the name.

Self: The true essence of the human psyche; the integrated individuality towards which all constructive psychic development strives. 2An individual's essential identity, referable to one or other of the main divisions of the total person: Higher Self, that part of the psyche which is more elevated than the rational mind: the Higher Unconciousness, the Spirit. Lower Self, the soul and the physical body together; the rational, emotional, instinctual, lower unconscious and material levels of the person.

Sensitive (as adjective): Having acute physical or mental perceptions, or emotional sensibility; (as noun) a person unusually susceptible to psychic influences.

Sephira (plural: Sephiroth): Any one of the ten spheres on the Tree of Life (q.v), the central concept of the Cabala (q.v). 2 One of the ten "Spheres" composing the Qabalistic "Tree of Life". Seven of the Sephiroth represent the modes of existence charaterized by the Seven Planets of traditional astrology.

Shadow: The buried, unconscious elements of the human psyche; everything except the Ego (q.v) and the Persona (q.v).

Shaman, Shamaness: A man or woman who has obtained knowledge of other dimensions as well as of the earth, usually through periods of alternate states of consciousness. This knowledge gives the shaman the power to change this world through magick. Once derisively known as "medicine men" and "witch doctors", shamans are once again respected as repositories of traditional healing, psychological, and magickal knowledge.² In many cultures, a priest like figure who communicates with the spirit world. 3 A man or woman who has obtained knowledge of the subtler dimensions of the Earth, usually through periods of alternate states of consciousness. Various types of Ritual allow the Shaman to pierce the veil of the physical world and to experience the realm of energies. This knowledge lends the shaman the power to change her or his world through Magick. (4) A priest or priestess who communicates with the inner planes by self-induced trance. Originally a North Asiatic tribal word, it has come to be used to describe such functionaries in other cultures.(5) An original priest of nature, who goes to the spirits who abide in that realm for power and insights into daily living. Shamanism has many varieties, as any other form of magick, and is among the most popular of the modern magickal schools because of its reverence for the earth. Like Pagans and Wiccans, shamans see the earth as a living, vital organism that is very important to our spiritual progress as well as our physical and mental well-being.

Shamanism: The practice of shamans, usually ritualistic or magickal in nature, and sometimes religious. Usually a derivative of a Native American tradition, the shaman's role is often one of healing, teaching, and divining. Shamanism is a tradition which usually has emphasis on ancestral and natural spirits. Those with shamanistic callings often feel very closely linked to the Earth and its creatures.

Shapeshifting: Shapeshifting is a type of glamoury but with a different

effect. The process transforms the magic user's outlook, perceptions, and understanding to that of the animal, plant, or person they're mimicking. Sometimes this auric transformation can be sensed by people around the magick user, but the ultimate goal of shapeshifting is not a literal one. Instead, the hope is to "walk in something else's shoes" to learn and grow from the experience.

Shield: A thought form or psychic barrier of protection.

Show Stone: A crystal ball or other polished stone used for scrying; see magickal mirror.

Sick-Building Syndrome: The set of symptoms, including headaches, dizziness, nausea, chest problems, and general fatigue associated with buildings with actual air pollution or inadequate ventilation, or negative environmental energies.

Sidereal Year: The time it takes for the earth to revolve around the sun; 365.256 days.

Sigil: An occult seal or sign. It should be pronounced to rhyme with 'vigil'.(2) A concept or principle designed by magickal formala to contain the essence of something.

Simple Feast, The: A ritual meal shared with the Goddess and God.

Simples: An old term used for medicinal herbs. Also, a term sometimes applied to the recipes for herbal restoratives.

Sky Clad: Participating in a circle, ritual, or other magickal activity without clothing. This is done in an effort to connect with nature and get away from the superficial. It is not necessary for any type of Wiccan worship, but is a matter of personal choice. ²The witches' word for 'ritually naked'. ²Clothed by the sky; i.e., naked. Some Wiccan traditions practice occasionally or regularly in the nude, while others wear robes. By tradition, nudity deemphasizes socio-economic differences, recognizes the sanctity of the human body, and allows the free flow of psychic energy. It is not an invitation to sexual advances or orgies.

Smudge Stick: A bundle of herbs - most often including sage, cedar and/ or lavender - which is lit. The smoke of these herbs is believed to alleviate negative influences and may be used to prepare a ritual space or aid in other spiritual activities, such as meditation.

Smudging: A method of purification, used by Native Americans, for the preparation of oneself and one's sacred place for spiritual practice. The process involves wafting about the smoke of slow burning herbs. 2Native American ceremony involving the burning of sage, sweetgrass, cedar, or any combination of these herbs in order to purify the psychic energy of an individual or area.

Soddag Valloo: Ritual cakes, baked and eaten at Samhain.

Solitary Wicca: Wicca practiced, due to either choice or circumstance, by individuals without group support. Compare with Group Wicca.

Solstice: The point in time when the sun is at its greatest distance from the celestial equator.

Solstices: See Sabbats, also Yule.

Gods and Goddesses South Pacific Polynesian (Hervey Islands) Vari-Ma-Te-Takere (The very beginning)



TYPE: Mother Goddess

INFORMATION: The creator being who lives at the very bottom of the world coconut, sitting in a cramped space with her knees and chin touching. She lives in Te-Enua-Te-Ki (mute land) in eternal silence and is the mother of six children, all deities, three of which she plucked from her right side and three from her left. See Avatea, Tinirau, Tango, Tumuteanoa, Raka, and Tu-Metua.

The primordial mother of the gods and the mortals, she was a female spirit who was admitted to the lowest depths of the interior of Avaiki, a place which resembled a hollowed out coconut shell. Her prison was so narrow that her knees touched her chin, and it did not allow for any other position for her.

Her full name Vari-Ma-Te-Takere translates to "The Very Beginning" The word Vari also means "Mud" and when it is placed in conjunction with the word *takere* (canoe bottom or keel) literally translates to the "Mud at the bottom" This translations suggests that the mud at the bottom of Avaiki is the mud of the *taro swamps*. Which due to the fact it connotates plant growth, is thus applied to a female representing menstruation. As seen in the verse below.

Vari alone made us.

That home of Vari is

The very narrowest of all!

Vari's home is in the narrowest of spaces,

A goddess feeding on raw taro

At appointed periods of worship!

Thy mother, Vatea, is self-existent.

Being that she was anxious to conceive progeny, she plucked the flesh from each side of her body and molded it into human form.

There names had significant meanings for each

Vatea (Avatea), the father of gods and men

Tinirau, lord of the seas

Tango, lord of the birds

Tumu-te-ana-oa, and echo of the rocks,

Raka, Lord of the winds

Tu-metua, The beloved daughter who stayed with her mother in Avaiki. She was the tutelary deity of the island of Moorea and the fourteenth night in every moon was sacred to her.

Amethyst Tallowgill

Laccaria amethystina



Common Name: Amethyst Tallowgill

Botanical Name: Laccaria amethystina

Order: Agaricales

Family: Hydnangiaceae

Description: Small to medium, slender mushroom. Purple all over. Surface of cap, watery; fades as it dries. Widely spaced gills

extend down fragile stalk.

Cap: 1-5cm wide. Convex. soon becoming depressed at center and sometimes becoming shallowly funnel-shaped in

age. Surface smooth at first, later becoming roughened as it breaks to form soft, somewhat powdery scales. Color varies, but some shade of purple all over. Hygrophanous—moderate violet to moderate purple when young and moist, fading to light reddish purple or lighter; flushed with reddish brown as purples fade and finally drying pur-

ple gray. Cap may be streaked near margin when moist. Odor and taste not distinctive.

Gills: Adnate (broadly attached) or decurrent (extending down stalk); sub-distant. Gills broad; colored like cap surface

or lighter, but violet persists longer than on cap.

Stalk: 3-8 x 0.4-1.0cm. Cylindric, zigzag, hollow at maturity. Surface fibrillose, colored like cap or lighter; base white-

cottony.

Spores: 7-9μ Echinate (spiny), non-amyloid, globose. Spore print white or flushed with pale violet. Clamps present on

hyphae.

Edibility: Edible

Season: Summer and Early Autumn

Habitat: Solitary or in groups or small clumps; in wet places, often in deep leaf litter, Hardwood forests.

Range: East of Great Plains, United States.

Look Alikes: Formerly considered a color variant of *Laccaria laccata*, but darker, more violet colors and tendency to develop a

more funnel shaped cap distinguish it. This is strictly a species of moist, shady hardwood forests in comparison with other tallowgills (species of *Laccaria*) that may be found in more open forests, grassy places or lawns, or

sandy soils and dunes.

Types of Divination

Lampadomancy: Divination by interpreting a candle or lamp, usually the flames.

Lecanomancy: Divination by interpreting the sound or image of an object or substance falling into a body of water.

Lesser Arcana: The 56 suit of cards in a Tarot deck that assist in fleshing out the situations indicated by the Trump cards (major arcana), or indicate smaller occurrences in our lives. Also known as the Minor Arcana.

Libranomancy: Divination by interpreting smoke from incense. A form of capnomancy.

Lithomancy: Divination using precious and semiprecious stones either by interpreting light reflected from stones, or casting them and interpreting the way they fall.

Livanomancy: see libranomancy.

Logarithmancy: Divination by interpreting logarithms.

Lunomancy: Divination by interpreting moonlight on a person's face dusted with silver.

Lychnomancy: Divination by interpreting the flames of three candles.

Macharomancy: Divination by interpreting knives or swords.

Major Arcana: The 22 trump cards depicting dominant occurrences in a Tarot deck.

Margaritomancy: Divination using pearls and interpreting the light reflected or the way they fall.

Metagnomy: Divination by interpreting visions received in a trance state.

Meteoromancy: Divination by interpreting falling stars.

Metoposcopy: Divination and character analysis through interpreting facial lines and wrinkles, especially of the forehead.

Minor Arcana: see lesser arcana.

Moleoscopy (moleosphy): Divination and character analysis by interpreting moles on the body.

Molybdomancy: Divination by interpreting molten tin or lead.

Myomancy: Divination by interpreting the appearance and behavior of mice.

Myrmomancy: Divination by interpreting the appearance and behavior of ants.

Necromancy: Divination through communication with ghosts or corpses. Not practiced in witchcraft or wicca. Specifically geared to summoning those spirits that are not existing in a "natural" state, and therefore they are assumed to be unhappy and/or malicious.

Nephelomancy: Divination by watching clouds shapes and movements.

Notarikon: Ta form of gematria in which the first and last letters of a word or phrase are put together to form a new word, or to turn a word into a phrase. A system of discovering truths and hidden meanings behind words.

Numerology (numeromancy): The system of magick and divination developed by Pythagoras. Used to analyze a person's character, assess weaknesses, strengths and natural gifts, predict ones future and fate.

Mantras and Mudras

In Vedic and Eastern Mystic traditions, as well as in Buddhism, and Hinduism Mantras and Mudras are often used in correlation with each other in order for to enhance meditative workings.

In this article I will not only explain the uses of Mantras but also show some of the various Mantras and mudras used and their meanings and usage;

Mantras:

Definition: A mantra is a short phrase or sound used to focus the mind and connect inwardly to the soul consciousness.

There are many mantra's, too many to actually list in their entirety but below are some common mantras and their meanings:

OM Mani Padme Hum ओम मणि पद्मे ह्रूँ is a well known Buddhist mantra it translates to "Praise to the Jewel in the Lotus" *Om* represents the sound of universal creation, *Mani* means Jewel, *Padme* refers to the sacred flower of the Lotus, and *Hum* means the "spirit of Enlightenment".

This chant is used to develop deep compassion, to achieve the six Buddhist perfections, and to reach enlightenment.

Another mantra less well known is "<u>Lokah Samastah Sukhino Bhavantu</u>" लोकाः समस्ताः सुखिनो भूवंतु This mantra translates to "May all things be joyful and free."

Here are some seed mantras or part mantra's used in combination with others to achieve some states of transcendental meditation and their meanings:

AUM (OM) ओम This is the primordial sound of the universe. And the most well-known and revered of the mantras.

<u>Sohum</u> सोहम "I AM" Derived from the Sanskrit words "Sah" (He) and "Aham" (I) it means I am That, or I am That I am. It signifies the interconnected of the self with the universal consciousness.

Aham Brahmasmi आहं ब्रह्मास्मि This mantra, meaning literally "I am Brahman" or allegorically "I am the Ultimate Reality" underscores the primary belief that one's divine nature is interconnected with one's physical consciousness.

Other commonly known Mantra's or key words to mantras are used in several Buddhist or Vedic chants these seed words are:

Sura सूरा Which means in Hindu "The many parts of Brahma" which connects one with the deities created by Brahma.

<u>Namaste</u> नमस्ते meaning "I bow to you" It is used as a greeting or closing but has a deeper meaning as it also means "I acknowledge the Divinity within you and within me."

Next we're going to move on to Mudras. Mudras are hand gestures which are used with mantras to reach certain levels of consciousness. They are designed to channel energy to the Chakras as well as to direct ones intentions. They are combined with Mantras to achieve efficacy and to deepen the meditative experience.

Below are some common Mudra/Mantra combinations used to balance the primary chakras:

Root Chakra (Muladhara) - Survival

With your hands placed on your knees your arms straight and outstretched while in lotus position, touch your thumb to your index finger making a circle. Let your other three fingers naturally fall in position. Your palms should remain facing open and upright.

Mantra: LAM this should be held in a long single outward breath. So one need to take a deep breath in and then release the breath with the tone. L-A-A-A M sound will draw out of the Root Chakra feel it's energy emanating from the base of your spine moving up your body. Visualize a bright red light as you do this. See this light moving upward and outward. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra combination for 1 minutes.

Sacral Chakra (Swadhisthana) - Creativity

Place your hands in your lap with your palms facing upwards cup your left hand and then place your right hand also in a cupped position within it touch your thumbs together forming a circle.

Mantra: VAM Take a long breath in and then release the breath with the tone. V-A-A-A-A-M sound will resonate with the Sacral Chakra feel it's energy emanating from your groin area and moving upwards through your body. Visualize a bright orange light as you do this. See this light moving upward and outward. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra combination for 2 minutes.

Solar Plexus Chakra (Manipura) - Will Power

Place your palms together fingers outstretched wrap your left thumb over your right thumb and place your hands between your heart and stomach two inches below the navel.

Mantra: RAM Take a long breath in and then release the breath with the tone R-A-A-A-M. The sound will resonate with the solar plexus and move upward through your body. Visualize a bright yellow light emanating from your solar plexus and moving upward and outward. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra combination for 3 minutes.

Heart Chakra (Anahata) - Love

Place your right hand index finger and thumb touching together palm inward against your Heart Centre. Place you left hand on your knee in the same mudra position.

Mantra: YAM. Take a long breath in and then release the breath with the tone Y-A-A-A-M. This sound will resonate with the Heart Chakra. Visualize a brilliant green light emanating from your heart and traveling upward and outward from your heart up and down your body feel the divine love of self as it empowers the Heart Chakra. Repeat this Mudra/Manta combination for 4 minutes.

Throat Chakra (Vishudda) - Expression

Place your right and left hands in a cupped position palms upward and interlace your fingers touching the tips of your thumbs together forming an oval. Place them by your stomach and focus your energy on the throat.

Mantra: HAM. Take a long breath in and release the breath with the tone H-A-A-A-M. This sound will resonate from your throat and feel it emanating from there. Visualize a sky blue light coming out of your throat and moving around your body. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra combination for 5 minutes

Third Eve Chakra (Ajna) - Intuition/Wisdom

Place your hands in front of the lower part of your breasts. Stand your middle fingers up and touch them at the tips. Bend the other fingers at the first joint and touch them together as shown in the image.

MANTRA: AUM. Take a long breath in and release it with the tone A-A-A-U-U-M. This sound will resonate with the Third Eye Chakra. Visualize a deep indigo color emanating from your Third Eye and projecting outward surrounding your body. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra Combination for 6 Minutes.



Crown Chakra (Sahasrara) - Spiritual Connection

Place your hands in front of your stomach, place your palms together interlace all but your little fingers and place your little fingers together, pointed upwards.

Mantra: ANG Take a long breath in and release it with the tone A-A-A-A-N-G This sound will resonate with the Crown Chakra. Visualize a violet color emanating from your Crown and projecting outward surrounding your body. Repeat this Mantra/Mudra Combination for 7Minutes.

Here are 14 other power Mudras for focusing on Emotional wellbeing. .



Acceptance Mudra

Hand Position: The index finger is folded into the space between thumb and this finger, so that the nail touches the fold. The outer lower corner of the thumb's nail touches the inner lower corner of the pinky nail.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: To overcome sadness or an unnecessary resistance to situations, this mudra can calp to get into the mood of acceptance.



Ahamkara Mudra

Hand Position: Bend index fingers slightly and put the upper phalanx of the thumb to the side of the middle phalanx of the index finger, at the upper part. Other fingers are straight.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Self-confidence and self-assertion. For counteracting fear and timidity.



Apan Mudra

Hand Position: Join the Middle finger and the ring finger with the tip of the thumb; the forefinger and the little finger should be held upright.

Physical Use: Moves energy to the periphery of the body. This may help with constipation and urinary problems.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Gives energy and make one more self-confident



Back Pain Mudra

Hand Position: Right hand; The thumb middle and pinky fingers touch ring and index finger are extended Left Hand; Put the thumbs' upper phalanx over the nail of the index finger.

Physical Use: Back pain and particularly of the lower back, can be a sore feeling. When muscles start cramping, it can become very painful. This mudra helps against this escalation.



Bhudy Mudra

Hand Position: The tips of the pinky finger and the thumb touch.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Improves feeling and Intuition.



Gyan Mudra

Hand Position: The tips of the thumb and index finger tough, other fingers are straight but relaxed. **Emotional/Spiritual Use:** Stimulates the Root chakra, and grounds, calms, and improves concentration



Hakini Mudra

Hand Position: Let the tips of the corresponding fingers of each hand touch.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: People tend to naturally put their fingers in this position while talking. This helps to concentrate.



Pran Mudra

Hand Position: The tips of the pinky and ring finger touch with the tip of the thumb.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Gives energy.



Prithvi Mudra

Hand Position: The tip of the ring finger and thumb touch.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Increases energy and fosters as sense of inner stability and self-assurance.



Shuni Mudra

Hand Position: The tips of the middle finger and the thumb touch

Emotional/Spiritual Use: Helps being aware of the moment, and thereby makes one more patient.









Energy Balancing Mudra Sequence

Hand Position: Alternately touch the tips of each finger with the tip of your thumb. Keep each connected for a few seconds or longer and do for a few minutes total. Do this with both hands.

Emotional/Spiritual Use: The overall effect is that you get calmer, more relaxed and concentrated. The separate mudras have the following individual effects:

Thumb/index finger: Opens the root chakra, and moves more energy to the legs and lower body. Makes one calmer and more con-

centrated

Thumb/middle finger: fosters patience

Thumb/ring finger: Energy Stability and self-confidence

Thumb/Pinky finger: Intuition and feeling.
