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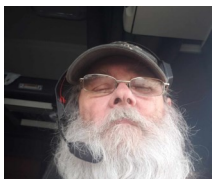


Meet the Staff

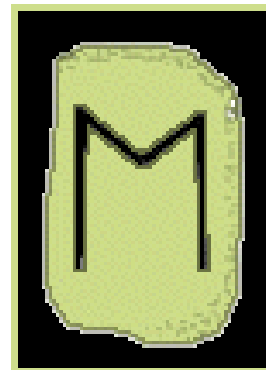
Melina Valdejo (Staff Writer)

Chives

Onions form a large genus of about 700 species of mostly strong-smelling, bulbous or rhizomatous biennials and perennials. Alliums are native to the northern hemisphere, Ethiopia, S Africa, and Mexico, and vary in hardiness according to origin. Various species have been cultivated since the earliest times and are universally important as vegetables, flavorings, and medicinal plants. Their typical smell is caused by sulphur compounds, which have beneficial effects on the circulatory, digestive, and respiratory systems. It varies in pungency from species to species, and a few are almost odorless. Garlic (*A. sativum*) is the most pungent and highest in therapeutic value. It is also one of the most ancient herbs, recorded in Babylonian times (c.3000BCE), found in the tomb of Tutankhamun (c.1370-52BCE), and consumed in large quantities by the ancient Greeks and Romans. The pervasive odor of garlic has always caused ambivalence, as in the Muslim legend that when Satan left the Garden of Eden after the Fall, garlic sprang up from his left footstep and onion from his right. There are many superstitions about garlic: it wards off vampires, causes moles to "leap out of the ground presently" (William Coles, *The Art of Simpling*, 1656), and, if chewed, prevent competitors from getting ahead in races. *Allium sativum* was first mentioned in Chinese medicine c.CE500. In Ayurvedic medicine it is known as rashona, "lacking one taste", referring to the absence of sourness, while possessing all five other tastes (pungent root, bitter leaf, astringent stem, saline top of stem, and sweet seed). There are two main kinds of garlic: "hardneck", which has an excellent flavor but is demanding to cultivate, does not store well, and is difficult to braid; and "softneck", which is productive, adaptable and stores well. *Allium canadense* (meadow garlic/leek, wild garlic, Canada onion) has medicinal properties similar to garlic, as well as scallion-like leaves and mild-flavored bulbs and bulbils. There are hundreds of kinds of onion (*A. cepa*) worldwide, adapted to latitude and climate, and varying in size, color, and flavor. *Allium cepa* is often subdivided into three main groups: the Cepa Group (common onion), which has single large bulbs; the Proliferum Group (tree, or Catawissa onion), which produces an inflorescence consisting largely of bulbils; and the Aggregatum Group (shallot, ever-ready onion, and potato, or multiplier onion), once classified as a separate species, *A. ascalonicum*, which forms clusters of small bulbs. In addition to their culinary and medicinal uses, onions, in the form of their brown or red-purple skins, are used as dye for Easter eggs in many countries. *Allium fistulosum* known as da cong in Mandarin and negi in Japanese, is the most important *Allium* species grown in China, Japan and SE Asia, and is much used in Chinese, Japanese, and Korean cuisines. Its medicinal uses were first described in Shen Nong's Canon of Herbs, c.CE25-200. *Allium tuberosum* is less used in Chinese medicine; it was mentioned c.CE500 in Ben Jing Ji Zhu by Tao Hong Jin. *Allium chinense* (rakkyo, baker's garlic) is similar to *A. schoenoprasum* in appearance but has brighter green, more angular leaves and shallot-like bulbs. The bulbs have a crisp texture and are used mainly for pickles. *Allium ampeloprasum* (Levant garlic) has several interesting forms, including leeks (Porrum Group); 'Perlzwiebel' which produces small solid (unlayered) "pearl onions" for pickling and the ornamental variety *babingtonii* (British or Welsh Leek), which is mildly leek flavored and has tall stems of bright purple flowers. The Middle Eastern Kurrat Group was found in ancient Egyptian tombs and is still cultivated today in the Middle East. It is similar to a leek but smaller, with narrower leaves and a more developed bulb, though the young leaves are the parts usually eaten. *Allium ledebourianum* (asatsuki, siu yuk) from China and Japan has an onion-garlic flavor. It produces chive-like green leaves and small, fleshy bulbs, known as "fire onions". *Allium scorodoprasum* (rocambole, sand leek) is cultivated to a limited extent in parts of Russia for its small garlic-flavored bulbs. Closely related is *Tulbaghia violacea* (see wild garlic).

Properties: Similar effect to other alliums, but is milder, rarely used medicinally.

Culinary Uses: Chives are especially good with potatoes and eggs. Leaves are used to garnish and flavor soups and salads, and in soft cheeses, omelets, and sauces such as *Remoulade* and *Ravigote*. Chopped chives and onions flavor Cotswold Cheese (England). Individually flowers are added to salads.

Alder Bracket Fungus

Inonotus radiatus

Common Name: Alder Bracket Fungus

Botanical Name: *Inonotus radiatus*

Order: Hymenochaetales

Family: Hymenochaetaceae

Description: Ochre to rusty-brown, overlapping, or laterally fusing fruitbodies; silky or hairy, blackening with age.

Cap: 1½-3½" (3-8cm) across;

½-2½" (2-6cm) deep,

Semicircular to kidney-shaped in outline; often arranged in shelves and sometimes fused laterally with other caps; usually convex to planoconvex; very finely velvety when young becoming bald with age; yellowish to orangish at first, becoming yellowish-brown to tan and eventually darkening to dark brown or black; often zoned; the margin thin and often wrinkled.

Pores: Grayish to yellowish-brown when young, becoming darker brown; bruising brown when young and gray; with 3-4 angular pores per mm; tubes to 3mm deep; with age becoming somewhat ragged and appearing "toothed"

Flesh: Yellowish-brown to rusty-brown, tough and stringy; faintly zoned.

Spores: 5.5-7 x 3.5-4.5µ smooth; ellipsoid, hyaline to brownish; nonamyloid.

Edibility: **Undefined, not recommended for consumption.**

Season: Summer and Fall occasionally over winters.

Habitat: Hardwood logs primarily on alders.

Range: Widely distributed in North America

Carnelian

Carnelian is a translucent or clear chalcedony or agate, red or orange to dark brown. It has also been found in salmon, sienna, and rust shades. The word itself is derived from the Latin word for flesh. It is found most in India and South America.

This stone holds power over the reproductive organs, the liver, and blood. The kidneys, lungs, gallbladder and pancreas find Carnelian useful as well. It will also assist with lower back problems, and strengthen the voice. Unhealthy skin also benefits.

Carnelian will help those seeking success in any matter and also stimulates curiosity and creativity.

It is said to keep evil at bay, and it is still worn in Persia and Arabia for luck. The vitality of the physical, emotional, or mental self is influenced by this gem, enhancing one's attunement with the inner self. Carnelian calms anger and focusing thought. It might also be used to give direction. Perhaps it could be used as a pendulum when seeking a new job. It is thought the color may help increase one's appetite.

In ancient Egypt, this jewel was worn by master architects who considered it the stone of form and design. It has often been found in Egyptian tombs. Warriors would wear it around their necks for courage and physical power over their enemies, while alchemists used this stone as a "boiling stone" to activate the powers of other agates. The prophet Mohammed is said to have had one a ring made from this gem to ward off the Evil Eye and envy. Napoleon carried a ring found in the sands of Egypt for courage.

Signs which would benefit from this stone are Aries, Leo, Virgo, and Capricorn. Timid people would also benefit. The power of this stone effects the navel, solar plexus, heart, and heart chakras.

This form of red chalcedony relieves sexual tension by redirecting the energy stored in the reproductive center of the body; it may also be used to excite sluggish sexual energy.

Unresolved feelings of anger, hostility, and hatred may be harmonized when carnelian is worn at the heart chakra, as this stone instills powerful sensations of well-being.

Like Bloodstone, deep orange-red carnelian may help to staunch the flow of blood.

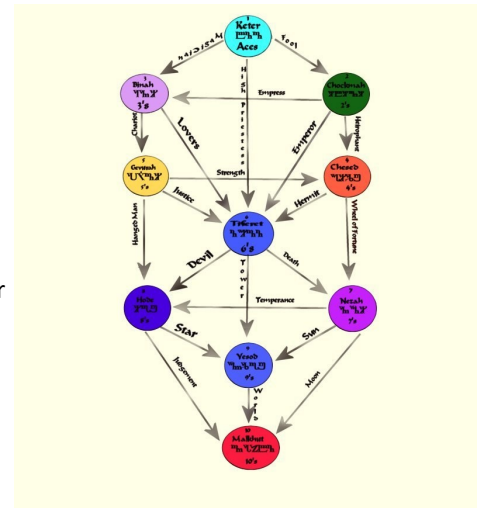

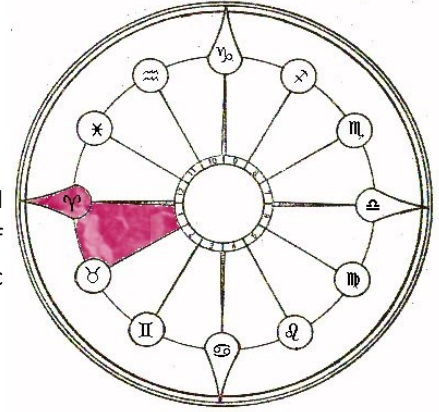

E

Earth: Another of the alchemical elements. Gnomes and goblins are considered Earth creatures. Taurus, Virgo, and Capricorn are governed by this element. Earth is a grounding element. It is used to symbolize growth and stability in Magick, and stands in the Northern point of a Magickal circle. In many Wiccan traditions, the element corresponding to the North; the colors black, yellow or forest green; and foundations, stability, the human body, all solid material things, and prosperity.

Earth Chakra: The chakra located between and slightly below the feet which holds the soul into incarnation and links the physical body to the earth.

Earth Healing: The attempt to rectify the distortion of the Earth's energies caused by pollution and the destruction of its resources.

Earthing: Sending excess energy into the Earth; done in ritual after power has been raised and sent to its goal.

Earth Power: That energy which exists within stones, herbs, flames, wind, water and other natural objects. It is manifested Divine Power and can be utilized during Magick to create needed change. Compare with Personal Power.

East: The place where most rituals begin for White Witches, East is the point of the morning star and new beginnings, thus a sign of illumination and new life. In the Magickal circle it is represented by the element of Air.

Ecliptic: The path that the sun appears to follow across the celestial sphere during the course of the year; the midline of the zodiac.

Ego: The conscious part of the human psyche.

Egregore(s): Beings whose bodies are composed of Astral Light formed by a Cult of worshippers and animated by emanations from the Divine Plane. Gods and Goddesses as visualized by Humankind and given the breath of life by the Source of All Things. In this way human minds can comprehend something of the Divine nature and establish a two-way communication.

Elders: The third-degree and second-degree members of a coven. One who is recognized as an experienced leader, teacher and counselor within the Craft.

Electrical Aura: The force-field which emanates from the physical body.

Electromagnetic Smog: A subtle but detectable electromagnetic field that can have an adverse effect on sensitive people. The smog is given off by electrical power lines and items such as, computers, cell phones, and televisions.

Electrum: The product of blending various metals, such as gold and silver. Rarely found in nature, electrum has a long magical history.

Elemental: Refers to the spirits of air, fire, water, and earth. 2A primitive nonhuman and nonmaterial entity, of the nature of one of the four Elements (q.v.). The term is also used for a human thought-form which, spontaneously by strong emotion or deliberately by mental effort, is split off from its human originator and acquires temporary quasi-independent existence. 'Created elementals' of the latter kind can be given healing work to do; they are also sometimes used maliciously for psychic persecution. 3A "nature-spirit"; one of the living beings of the Astral World, less individualized than human beings, subrational, but highly sensitive, reactive and mimetic.

Elemental Energies: The energies and symbols generated by the four main elements in nature, namely, earth, air, fire and water.

The Dictionary of Pagan Terms (continued)

E

Elements, The: Earth, air, fire and water. These four essences are the building blocks of the universe, and ancient Magickal sources of energy. Everything that exists (or that has potential to exist) contains one or more of these energies. The elements are also at large in the world and hum within ourselves, and can be utilized through Magick to cause change. They are formed from the primal essence or power, Akasha. See also Akasha. In the Middle Ages, the world was divided up by alchemists into four major elements: Earth, Air, Fire and Water. In the Tarot these are represented respectively by pentagrams, wands, swords, and cups. In the Cabalistic Tradition, the sacred name of God, YHWH likewise carried the elements in order of Fire, Water, Air and Earth. The Hindu faith adds one more element, that of Spirit, or Ether, to represent the other four in perfect balance, the center of the pentagram, and the Void. Earth, air, fire and water - plus spirit which includes and integrates them all. These are regarded as realms or categories of Nature - the basic modes of existence and action. They are not to be confused with the physicist's table of elements, which the witch or course accepts in their relevant context. (4) In classical Magick, Earth, Air, Fire, or Water, each representing a class of energies in the universe, and all of which together make up Spirit and the reality we know. See listings for each element. (5) In Western Occultism the Four Elements of Creation: Earth, Air, Fire, and Water. They are etheric substances reflected in material counterparts.

Empowering: The act of moving Energy into an object. The movement of personal energies into herbs, stones, or other objects. The empowered objects are then used in Magick. In herb Magick, empowering aligns the energies within herbs with Magickal goals.

Energy: A general term for the currently unmeasurable (but real) power that exists within all natural objects and beings - including our own bodies. It is used in Folk Magick. See also Personal Power.

Enfleurage: A French perfumery term describing the process of extracting essential flower oils with purified fat. Also, known as pommade.

Equilibrium: The balancing of forces in their opposing activities. A magickal regulation of forces in motion. A reconciling of opposites.

Equinox: The point in time at which the sun crosses the celestial equator.

Equinoxes: See Sabbats.

Esbat: The regular meeting of a circle/coven in which a ritual of worship is performed, including a Magickal working or healing, and group business/announcements are taken care of. Full Moon, Esbats are most common, although some groups also meet at New Moon. 2A Magickal meeting which celebrates a particular phase of the moon, most often the Full Moon. Considered a good time to concentrate on Magickal teaching, especially as it pertains to intuition and creativity. 3A Wiccan ritual, usually occurring on the Full Moon. 4A Wiccan ritual occurring on any day other than the eight Sabbats. Esbats are often held on full moons, which are dedicated to the Goddess. 5A coven meeting other than one of the eight seasonal festivals or Sabbats (q.v.). 6A gathering of Witches to celebrate a certain phase of the Moon (most commonly the full moon), work magick, and socialize; from the French word meaning "to frolic." 7In ancient Babylonian-Akkadian traditions the monthly lunar celebrations were called eses, This may also be another origin of the term Esbat. 8A coven meeting other than a sabbat, usually on the full moon.

Essential Oil: Essential oils are fragrant, volatile substances produced by certain types of plants. In a sense, they are the "blood" of the plant, the manifestation of the life force which created it. In Magickal aromatherapy, the term usually refers to the liquids themselves, freed from the plants which created them. These natural aromas are the key tools of Aromatherapy. They are also known as volatile oils and ethereals.

Esoteric Thought: Nonscientific, nonmaterial thought based on a belief in the existence of metaphysics rather than any one school of thought.

Ether: An intangible material substance as opposed to a spiritual substance. It often refers to an unseen vaporous substance, as well as to the occult counterpart of an atmosphere.

E

Ether: An intangible material substance as opposed to a spiritual substance. It often refers to an unseen vaporous substance, as well as to the occult counterpart of an atmosphere.

Etheric: Composed of Ether. An intangible force or substance. Sometimes used to differentiate between Spirit and Matter.

Etheric Blueprint: The subtle program from which a physical body is constructed. It carries imprints of past life dis-ease or injury from which present-life illness or disability can result.

Etheric Body: The subtle biomagnetic sheath surrounding the body, also known as the Aura. A subtle body, similar in shape to the physical body, through which life-energy is said to flow. The Etheric body interpenetrates every atom of the physical body and is visible to clairvoyants as a network of energy streams. A structure intermediate between the Astral body (q.v.) and the physical body. It is an energy-network which links the physical body to the corresponding astral, mental and spiritual bodies, and thus literally keeps it alive.

Etheric Plane: The energy-level, intermediate between the astral and physical, on which the Etheric Body (q.v.) Functions.

Evil Eye: The supposed glance capable of inflicting great harm to others. Also: Psychic Attack.

Evocation: Calling up spirits or other non-physical entities, either to visible appearance or invisible attendance. Compare with Invocation. The summoning of a non-material entity of a lower order of being than oneself. (Cf. Invocation.)

Evoke: To call forth, to summon, as to call an elemental to a Watchtower.

Exorcism: Traditionally, the magickal process of driving out negative entities. In herb magick, a powerful purification. The expulsion, by psychic means, of an unwelcome entity from a person or place which it is influencing or possessing.

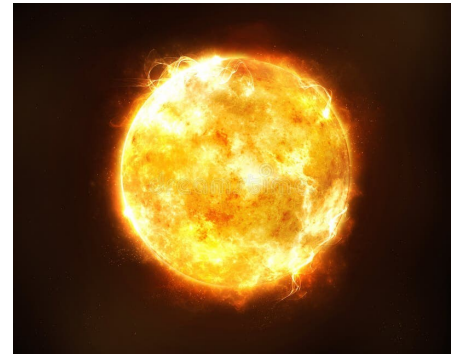

AXINOMANCY	Divination using an axe or hatchet. Both the handle and blade are used in various forms.
ABACOMANCY	Foretelling the future by observing patterns of dust. The way the dust is blown, distributed or disturbed is read very much like tea leaves. Cremated ashes of recently deceased are often sprinkled on a silver tray in this form of divination.
AUTOMANZIA	An obscure method of divination using ten straight pins and three bent pins placed in water, to indicate the future or potential hazards.
ACULTOMANCY	Divination using needles. Placing 21 needles in a saucer or shallow dish and pouring water over them and read what forces or how many are in operation for you are read by determining the amount that cross each other. Needles can also be used in pendular scrying.
AUTOGRAPHY	Spirit communication done unconsciously by an individual often in trance, obsession, or possession states, or meditative states.
AEROMANCY	Divination interpreting atmospheric conditions. Other forms are Austromancy (wind); Ceraunoscopy (thunder and lightning); Chaomancy (Aerial visions); Meteoromancy (Meteors, shooting stars).
AUSTROMANCY	Divination interpreting the directions of the winds or the movement of the wind.
AILUROMANCY	Divination through interpreting the appearance and behavior through cats.
AURISPICY	Another form of Astragalomancy using particularly the knuckle bones and ankle bones from sheep and goats.
ALECTORMANCY	Divination through interpreting the appearance and actions of sacred chickens. Current versions include watching the way fowl eat grain, cocks crow, etc.
AUGURY	Often used with divination to mean interpretation of signs and omens. In particular the appearance and behavior of animals.
ALEUROMANCY	Divination through sortilege of fortunes written on slips of paper. The papers are inside balls of dough which are baked, mixed, and handed out randomly. What is now done for Ash Wednesday in pancakes and also Fortune Cookies.
ASTROLOGY	Divination by interpreting the movements of heavenly bodies, major planets in particular.
ALOMANCY	Divination by interpreting salt.
ASTRAGALOMANCY	Divination through the sortilege of sheep bones (commonly done with dice with numbers and letters).
ALPHITOMANCY	A divination practice to identify guilty persons by feeding a loaf of barley. Innocents would feel no effects, guilty ones would experience indigestion. (Also known as Cursed Bread).
ASPIDOMANCY	Divining by entering casting a circle and summoning an entity.
ALVEROMANCY	Divination interpreting the intensity of sound.
ARUSPICY	Divination by interpreting animal entrails.
AMBULOMANCY	Divination interpreting the observation of the way a person walks.
ARMOMANCY	Divining by interpreting the shoulders of a person.
AMNIOMANCY	Divination by inspecting and interpreting the caul of a baby at birth.
ARITHMOSOPHY	Divination by Bertiaux's method of converting words into numbers.
ANTHOMANCY	Divination using flowers in relationship to the observer.
ARITHMANCY	Divination by interpreting numbers. (Numerology).
ANTHRACOMANCY	Divination by inspection of burning coals and gazing into the fires produced by the coal and interpreting the visualization of the smoke and flames. (Pyromancy)
ARIOLATIO	Divining by interpreting altars.

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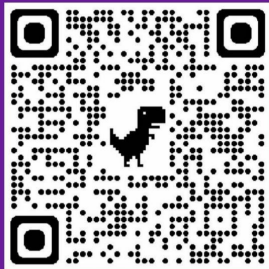
